Maurice Costello of Bayfield Street, who was a patient in Charlottetown Hospital since May left this morning for Halifax Hospital where he will receive medical treatment.



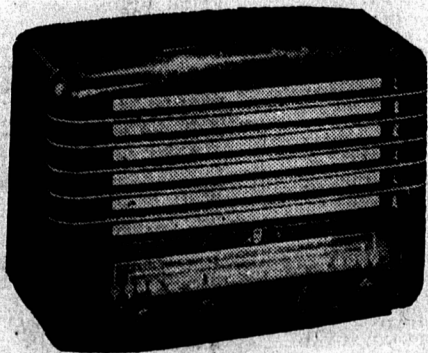

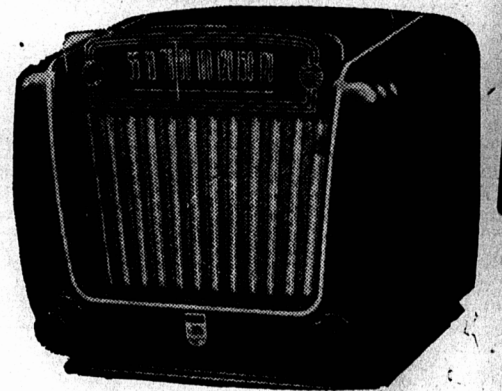
