U.S. Cabinet Car Threats Spark Canadian Caution

Sabre-rattling in the U.S. cabinet over Canada's plan to create auto parts exports to the United States produced a cautionary note among Canada's car makers last week.
The U.S. treasury department said it is considering whether a countervailing duty should be imposed on imports of Canadian autos and parts and in- vited public comment on the issue.
Complaints are expected to pour in from U.S. parts producers who say that the Canadian plan has taken markets away from them, thrown hundreds of U.S. employees out of work and crippled plant operations.
With one exception, Canadian auto manufacturers weren't talking last week, and adopted a "wait and see" attitude about the U.S. move.
The exception was Gordon E. Gaudet, president of Studebaker of Canada Ltd. and the Studebaker Corp. auto division in Southfield, Mich. Gaudet said he and his colleagues are pleased and says the treasury department's call for comment is just part of the normal process of law in the United States. "It's being played out exactly as we anticipated," he said.
Other car makers were a little laudicial. One spokesman said "everybody is holding its breath on all this business and saying as little as possible."
The plan is the brainchild of industry executives. Bob Drury and provides that for every \$1 increase in exports of Canadian automotive products worth of automotive products from abroad.
Canada's car makers probably have little to worry about, because expected to be going to bat for them are the U.S. auto producers who are happy about the Drury plan. They have even been known to lobby for it.
