Naval Exercises Off Halifax

HALIFAX, May 31—(CP)—A this port yesterday took the Canadian-United States Defence Board away from paper work and one of the joint chairmen—Canada's Gen. A. G. L. McNaughton—said he was greatly impressed by the anti-submarine wallop packed by the Canadian Navy's Atlantic Squadron.

Fog patches restricted the exercises to some extent but Gen. McNaughton said the Board members were satisfied and he was especially pleased that Dr. O. M. Solandt, Defence Research Board

chairman and chief of Canada's "Wizzard Warfare" was along to fill in the party on the science of the submarine killing.

As Gen. McNaughton put it, it was a day well spent away from the paper work piled before the Board which is making a special study of anti-submarine preparedness in their three-day conference here.

The squadron of eight ships left the harbor with some ceremony because of the number of high-ranking officers from both countries aboard. Bosuns pipes blew, salutes were fired and pennants raised and dipped. It was possibly one of the biggest Canadian naval demonstrations in public since the end of the war.
