Fire Marshal Guest Speaker At Alberton — Mr. T. A. Campbell, provincial fire marshal, Charlottetown, was special speaker at the regular meeting of Alberton Fire Dept. held last night in the Legion hall.

Fire Marshal Campbell outlined proper fire fighting methods, organization of a volunteer fire brigade and stressed the importance of a town or village making provision for protection of the members of their volunteer fire brigade, in case of injury, by insurance coverage as they are required to enter dangerous places in the carrying out of their duties. The fire Dept. chief, he said, is a deputy fire marshal and has a lot of authority during a fire, such as stopping all traffic, calling on R.C.M.P. and other agencies for any assistance he deems necessary. He considered a brigade should consist of about twenty well trained members with an auxiliary group as standby. Both groups should be required to attend eighty percent of all fires, practices and meetings.

A hearty vote of thanks was moved to Mr. Campbell for his informative address. Fire Chief J. C. Profit presided during the regular business meeting of the Fire Dept. Following discussion, it was decided.
