was the winning goalie.

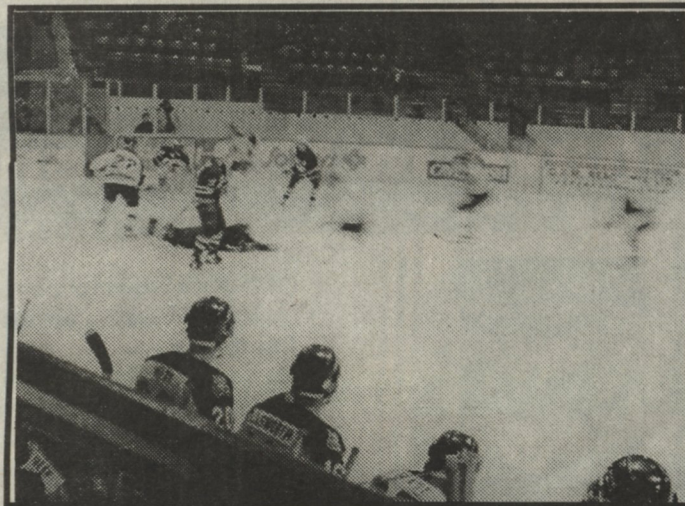
"The game on Friday went very well," Nick Grady, first-year, said. Sunday's game against the Moncton Blue Eagles did not go as well for the Panthers.

# Lady Panthers split victories with MUN

Now that basketball regular season play has commenced, it is clear that coach Tracy Ellsworth will depend on four key players to carry the UPEI Lady Panthers to victory this season. Krista Connolly, Marie-Claude Couture, Kate Ellis and Christine Larouche propelled the team to split with the Memorial Sea Hawks on November 13 and 14.

On Saturday, Connolly led all scorers with 21 points and was named player of the game in a 67-66 Panther victory. Ellis added 15 points and dominated the boards with 11 rebounds, while Larouche also netted 15. Couture provided the leadership role and controlled the tempo throughout the game, scoring eight points and adding five rebounds for UPEI. Melissa Skanes was Memori-

al's top scorer with 20 points, while Ann Murrin added 17 in the losing effort.

Sunday's game, the Panthers led the Sea Hawks at the half, 39-33, but were unable to continue their efforts. UPEI shot 21 percent from the field and scored only 16 points in the second half, in a 60-55 loss. Murrin was named player of the game for Memorial, with a 21 point and 10 rebound effort. Ellis led all scores for UPEI with 15 points and six rebounds. Larouche potted 11 points and eight rebounds, while Couture added 11 points. Connolly added ten rebounds in the defeat.

The Panthers next regular season home game is on November 26th against St. FX, they are anxiously awaiting the return of Kate Myron who has a nagging back injury.
