WINNIPEG, (CP)—Evidence of export interest in oats and barley featured an otherwise inactive session Thursday on the Winnipeg grain exchange. Prices of both grains generally closed slightly lower as offerings were about in line with the demand. The United Kingdom was reported to have bought small lots of feeding grades in both grains. United States interests were reported to have bought 300,000 bushels of maturing barley. Flax and rye trade was mostly local and prices were lower. Prices for the top grades of class two wheat dropped three-quarters of a cent from Wednesday. IWA and domestic wheat prices advanced one-quarter.

Premier is negotiating with the other Atlantic Provinces to establish a joint project in caring for sick children. Mrs. MacKinnon suggested that with foresight and determination it would not be long before a home for retarded children could be established. She thanked the convention warmly for electing her as a delegate to the A. C. W. W. conference to be held in Toronto this year.

"Meet the Health Department" was one of the highlights of the morning session when eleven officials of that department were introduced and made short two minute speeches. They were Hon. B. Earle MacDonald, Minister of Health and Welfare; Dr. O. W. Curtis Deputy Minister; Dr. O. Meara, Division of Dental Health; Miss Hazel Roland, Provincial Nutritionist; Mr. W. T. Crockett, Division of Vital Statistics; Dr. W. T. Hooper, Cancer Research Clinic; Miss Mary Wilson E. M. Director of Public Health Nursing; Mr. Robert Donnelly, Division of Sanitary Engineering; Dr. A. J. Murchison, Superintendent of Falconwood Hospital and Dr. J. H. Shaw, Provincial Health Laboratory.

Health Problems Hon. Mr. MacDonald expressed his thanks to the Women's Institute for the help they have been to his department in opening new fields in the matter of public health. Dr. Crockett said that the fight against tuberculosis has made steady progress "but we need that push that will put it over the hill."

In giving some statistics on birth, marriage and death Mr. W. T. Crockett noted that there were more deaths of mothers due to childbirth during the past year, but there is still some concern about the infant death rate.

Early diagnosis of cancer was stressed by Dr. Hooper and followed-up checkups were essential. Miss Wilson noted that there were 10 public health nurses on the Jersey side of the school districts, but there was a need for more. The Mental Health clinic in Charlottetown was discussed by Dr. Murchison who suggested that any persons who required the services of the clinic could obtain such, free of charge.

The Jubilee endowment fund which provides scholarships in home economics for girls from the province was explained by Mrs. Howard Wood.

Dr. J. H. Shaw suggested that it was useless to expound on the prevention of diseases when so many of our people are being killed on the highway each year. As a preventative measure he advocated better education and driver endorsement of the traffic laws.

Mrs. Dece MacNeill of Caplaw, who was the report on Arts and Literature, stated that no matter how crude a drama, a child may complete a course should be given in lieu of criticism as these attempts were outlets for the child's talent. Dece was forthcoming for Mrs. Willard MacKay of Vernon who was so successful with her classes during the past year. She observed that the music and drama festival had made great strides during the previous year. The problem of sending children to read books that are educational and uplifting is one for serious thought said Mrs. MacNeill and invited suggestions on this subject.

As a relaxation from the business sessions, the members were taken to the firm of M. Schriener where they were able to inspect and admire a model kitchen on display by the company. From there they went to the Excelsior farm where a very enjoyable barbecue awaited.
