Japanese Konwakai Club Holds Trade Meeting Here

Crop Insurance Deadline June 30

June 30 is the deadline for provincial farmers to take out insurance on this year's pot to and grain crops.

Crop insurance agency manager Edison Drake said yesterday that crop insurance sales to date have been heavier than last year with a large number "of the bigger growers taking advantage of the scheme."

Mr. Drake said that anyone wanting to take out insurance before the June 30 deadline should contact the crop insurance agency in Charlottetown.

Insurance is available for potato and grain crops. Cost of insuring an acre of potatoes is \$5.00, while the cost of grain insurance is 50 cents per acre.
