

Rewards For Heroism Go To Ages From 66 Down To 4

TORONTO (CP) — A silver medal, only the 13th listed in its history, was among the 50 awards for heroism announced tonight by the Royal Canadian Humane Association for bravery in 1956.

Among other awards was a bronze medal for a 66-year-old man in Chateaugay, Que., and a parchment certificate for a four-year-old heroine in Harrop, B.C., youngest person ever to receive a bravery award from the association.

The silver medal winner is Louis Fabry of Montreal, who was crossing a bridge to a dam, near St. Timothee, north of Montreal, when he spotted a motorboat with four persons aboard battling the heavy current. The boat capsized and he dove in to save two women. He again entered the water with another man to pull the sinking boat, to which a man and girl were clinging, to safety.

SAVED FROM TRAIN

U. J. Bourdon, 66-year-old retired railroad man, receives the bronze medal for saving little Carole Bolduc who was caught in the rails as a freight train was approaching at Chateaugay on Sept. 23. He struggled to free the girl, at the same time giving the engineer of the train the signal for the emergency brake to be applied. The train was only a few feet distant when he extricated the girl and jumped to safety.

Louis Anderson, four years old, receives a parchment certificate for rescuing 18-month-old Gloria Brooks from drowning in a water hole at Harrop, B.C., last Oct. 25. Besides the silver medal, the awards list has eight bronze medals and 41 parchment certificates.

Two of the parchment certificates set a precedent by awards to members of the police force. They were granted to Constable H. D. Bowyer and Acting Corporal K. M. McHale of the RCMP at Invermere, B.C., for a quarry rescue which the association says it felt was an instance of action beyond the call of duty.

Parchment certificates also were awarded to two organizations, the British Columbia Mountaineering Club and the Alpine Club of Canada, for participating in the rescue Oct. 20 of Alvin Patterson, stranded for five days on a narrow rock ledge on Mount Seymour.

Orris Watson, Ruby Lake, B.C., who dove into the lake to bring out three persons whose car had skidded into the water on Dec. 25. One was revived, but the two others were dead.

Wayne Peters, 13, Sydenham, Ont., who rescued a woman from drowning in Black Lake on July 8.

Joseph Schormann, Quebec City, who tried unsuccessfully to save R. H. T. Gordon after he fell down a ladder on an inspection of various tanks in the motorship Chapman.

Douglas Manuel, Lester Andrews, Christopher Sturge and Leo Kean, who combined in operations to tow a burning oil tanker out of Port at Tillamook, Nfld., before it exploded on Sept. 19.

Adenauer Refuses To Reject U.S. A-Weapons For Germany

BONN (Reuters) — Chancellor Konrad Adenauer's government Friday rejected left-wing demands that it bar the United States from stationing atomic weapons on West German territory.

A government statement in parliament, prepared in answer to questions by the opposition Social Democrats, declared that American troops cannot be expected to defend Germany under such a restriction.

"Whoever demands from the United States a full security guarantee for the federal republic, including West Berlin, must give the United States the possibility of making the necessary preparations for the effectiveness and reliability of that guarantee," it stated.

The motion also urged the government not to equip the new West German army with atomic weapons.

Bonn, it said, should appeal to the governments of the United States, Britain and Russia to make proposals for the control, limitation and finally ending of nuclear test explosions, and to halt such tests during consideration of the proposals.

The government said it has not so far asked for atomic weapons for its troops, nor been offered them.
