MONTREAL, June 13.—An apostolic trial is now going on before Archbishop Fabre, regarding the alleged miraculous cure of Frere Netholme, a member of the order of Christy brothers. Frere Netholme in 1888 was struck with paralysis, so much so that a pin could be run into his body its whole length without him feeling it, and when a finger was pressed against his flesh the indentation remained. The doctors gave him up, but the anniversary of St. Jean Baptiste de La Salle, founder of the order, whose trial for canonization is now going on at Rome, came round, Frere Netholme undertook a novena in nine days prayer. It ended on May 4th, when he was carried to church. As soon as he had partaken of the eucharist Frere Netholme felt a sensation through his body and immediately regained his health and strength. The doctors who attended him testified that medical art had nothing to do with his recovery.
