

Murphy Pitches Morell To First

Louis Murphy came up with another blue-ribbon pitching effort yesterday afternoon as Morell Beavers defeated Hampton, N.B., 7-1 in the first game of their best-of-three series for the Maritime Intermediate "B" baseball championship. More than 2,000 fans watched the game at Morell field.

Murphy, undefeated in eight consecutive games against Cardigan, Mt. Stewart, Tignish, Fort Williams, N.S., and now Hampton, gave up two hits yesterday as he went the distance for the win, and struck out 14 batters. One of the hits was a wind-blown home run by Hampton catcher, Jim London.

Morell backed Murphy with a strong, 11-hit attack. Top man for the home club was Mike Kelly, with three hits in five trips, including a key, two-run homer in the seventh inning which broke up a close pitching duel, giving Morell a 4-1 lead at the time.

Morell scored single runs in the first and sixth to take a 2-0 lead. Hampton made it 2-1 in the seventh on London's homer to right field, and then Kelly's two-run blast made it 4-1. The winners added three more runs in the bottom of the eighth to wrap it up.

Catcher Brian McGuire, one of six McGuire brothers on the Morell club, played a strong defensive game for the winners, cutting down three Hampton baserunners at second base with his strong right arm.

The series will be completed next weekend at Saint John.

Torres Wins Third Defence

SAN JUAN (AP) — Jose Chegu Torres won his third light-heavyweight title defence Saturday night by knocking out challenger Chic Calderwood with a right hook in 2:06 of the second round.

The 29-year-old Scottish challenger went down on his back and doubled up. He tried to get to his feet as referee Teddy Martin counted but stumbled through the ropes and the fight ended.

Torres, 30, a New York born Puerto Rican, finished Calderwood with the first real good punch of the scheduled 15-round fight.

For the first round and the first two minutes of the second, both fighters had jabbed lightly and cautiously at each other looking for openings.

Torres was an 8-5 favorite but the fight had been expected to be a drawn-out slugfest. Calderwood, the taller fighter of the two, has a hard left jab and tried to get to Torres' head. But Torres kept both hands close to his cheeks and waited patiently for his opening.

His famous left hook began to redden Calderwood's body and then suddenly he found the opening to Calderwood's head.

The victory was Torres' 33th against one loss and one draw, greatly enhanced his hopes for a title shot with heavyweight champion Cassius Clay.

Torres had said before the fight that if he defeated Calderwood and Dick Tiger in a New York fight scheduled for Dec. 12, he will ask Clay for a match.

Ottawa Clinches 1st. Place With Big Win Over Ti-cats

OTTAWA (CP) — Ottawa Rough Riders clinched first place in the Eastern Football Conference Sunday with a fourth-quarter rally that defeated Hamilton Tiger-Cats 20-18 before a record crowd of 24,015 fans.

The Riders had to come from an 18-13 deficit with a touchdown by halfback Ron Stewart on a three-yard pounce for the victory.

Then Riders stopped Hamilton's final offensive thrust when halfback Gene Gaines intercepted a pass by quarterback Frank Cosensio on the Ottawa 29 with seconds remaining.

Both Ottawa and Hamilton have two games to play but the Riders now lead the second-place Ticats by six points. Last time the Riders finished first was 1951, in a three-way tie with Hamilton and Toronto Argonauts.

POIRIER A STAR

Defensive halfback Joe Poirier was the hero of the game with a 35-yard interception and a 20-yard punt. Ottawa's first touchdown was Poirier's first on field goals from 21 and 24 yards and two converts by tackle Moe Racine.

Quarterback Joe Zuger scored one Hamilton touchdown and completed a 26-yard pass to flanker Tommy Grant for the other. Halfback Don Sutherland kicked a 40-yard field goal, two singles on wide field-goal attempts and one convert to complete the Ticat scoring.

A fumble at centre field gave Acadia the ball and eight plays later, halfback Ron Staskey bulled over from the two yard line for Acadia's first touchdown. He scored two more in the game.

On the next sequence, the local club was forced to punt and a snap to punter Jim Foley, enabled him to be thrown for a huge loss at the Saint thirty. In four plays Acadia scored again with halfback John Glasovic running fifteen yards for the touchdown. After the convert, the score stood at 13-0.

Early in the second quarter, the Saints finally got a march going, culminating in a four yard touchdown run by Foley.

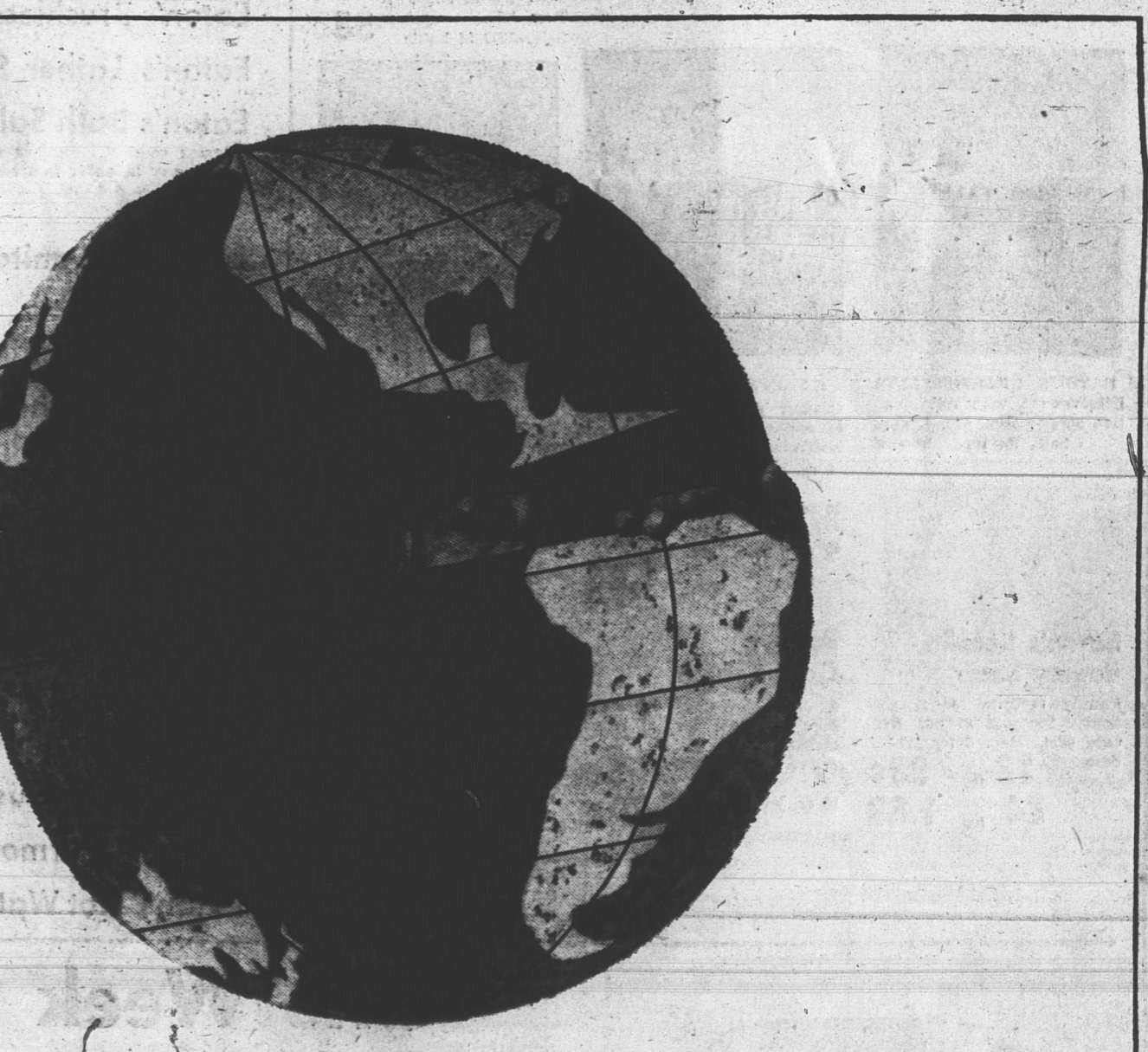
Right after the kickoff, Acadia marched 66 yards for a touchdown, this one on an eight yard keeper by Quarterback Wally O'Meara. There was no convert.
