The Island view that equalization payments to all the provinces should be based on the yield of the top province in its brief P.E.I. said that the present formula has been to the Island's advantage inasmuch as 30 per cent of the gross yield of provincial natural resources revenues should be added to the formula. It was pointed out, for example, that the per capita yield in 1953 from natural resources in Alberta was \$8.53 compared to only 23 cents for P.E.I.

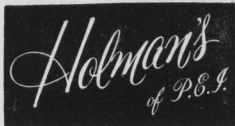
**ENTITLED TO SHARE**  
"The growth of natural resources is something in which this province never before fairly shared and it is something to which we are justly entitled as a member province of Canada," the Island Premier said. "Our province's views on this matter are that future financial arrangements recognizing basic inequality of the provinces and all factors affecting their economy. Federal tax revenues are the result of the collective efforts of all citizens of Canada and should be distributed in an endeavor to equalize standards of services as between the different provinces."

At the same time, Mr. Shaw made it clear that P.E.I. feels it would not be in the public interest to ask the federal government to vacate completely any major tax field. To do so would force P.E.I. to greatly retrench in its development program and on other essential services.

Under the present fiscal arrangements P.E.I. is receiving payments which it could not collect on its own if the federal government withdrew entirely from the personal income and corporation tax and succession duty fields.

"We in Prince Edward Island are reluctant to see any change in fiscal arrangements which would ignore the fiscal needs of provinces which are not as far ahead in industrial development as others," Premier Shaw stated.

**OTTAWA (CP)** — Value of cheques cashed in 51 Canadian clearing houses in September was \$28,612,291,000, an increase of 17.4 per cent from the same month a year ago, the Dominion Bureau of Statistics reports. That brought the January-September total to \$228,623,600,000, an increase of 11.8 from a year ago.

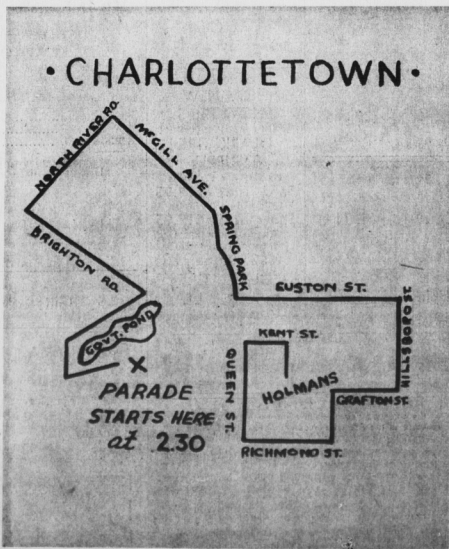
