Hand details: North 7 Q J 10 4 2, South 10 7 5 3, East 4 A K 10, West 4 Q 8 8 5.

The bidding: North Pass, East Pass, South Pass, West 1 Spade.

South made his doubled contract with ease, the defenders taking only one spade, one heart and one club.
