CHAMBERLAIN IN STATEMENT TO COMMONS

Recognizes Japanese Military Necessity—Disavows "Bribe" To Germany.

LONDON, July 24—Great Britain today promised to respect Japanese rights in the conquered areas of China while disavowing plans to make a vast loan to Germany or to take any action which might look like bribery to buy peace.
