In Memoriam

MRS. WILLIAM W. CROSBY The people of Cornwall and vicinity were greatly saddened by the word that reached them of the passing on January 31st, 1955, in the City of Montreal, of Mrs. William W. Crosby who for many years resided in the Meadowbank District. Her maiden name was Winnifred Frances White and she was a daughter of the late John T. and Caroline (Wilson) White. She was born at Montague, P. E. I., Jan. 17th, 1877. When she was about five years of age the family moved to Malden, Mass., where she received her education and graduated from the Malden High School. Afterwards she graduated in elocution from the Emerson School of Oratory, Boston. In 1896 her father retired and bought a home at Cornwall, P. E. I. Two years later Mr. and Mrs. Crosby were married and thereafter lived in their beautiful home by the side of the West River.

Mrs. Crosby was not only an ideal wife and mother and graceful hostess, but also a public spirited citizen, taking a vital interest in the welfare of the young people of the community and in the advancement of the educational and cultural features of rural life. She was influential in the establishment of the Provincial Women's Institute Organization and for some years was a member of its Executive. It is interesting to recall that she presided at Cornwall on March 14th, 1913 at the first meeting to organize under the Department of Agriculture.

The funeral service held February 4th, in Cornwall Church was largely attended, the church being filled to capacity. The attendance of so many as well as the beautiful floral tributes helped to bespeak the respect of the neighborhood for the friend who had entered into her Eternal Rest. The service was conducted by her pastor, Rev. Dr. A. S. Weir who in his address of comfort to the bereaved family and sorrowing friends, paid tribute to the fine Christian character of Mrs. Crosby who was so highly esteemed in the community at large and who will long be remembered by family and friends.

She leaves to mourn their great loss two daughters, Marie (Mrs. J. Gordon McLeod) of Charlottetown, and Peris (Mrs. L. M. Shetter) of Montreal; also one son, John, at home. She is survived also by one sister, Mrs. S. H. Robertson, of Boston. Mrs. Crosby was predeceased by her husband eleven years ago and also by a daughter, Lottie, in 1924.

Interment took place in Meadowbank Cemetery. The deep sympathy of their home community and of many friends in other places is respectfully extended to each of those so keenly bereaved.
