The achievement of a young Englishman, Mr. Albert B. Lloyd, who has just accomplished a remarkable journey in Africa takes rank as one of the most adventurous and courageous exploits of present day explorers.

Mr. Lloyd explored the country of the Pigmies, lived with cannibal tribes, underwent many perils by land and water, and finally emerged unscathed.

The most interesting portion of the published interview is that which relates to the dark forest in which live the Pigmies. The gloom of the immense forest is so dense that at noon it was impossible to read in it.

The description of the great forest is most impressive. In its dark glades perfect stillness reigned, save when a tree fell with a crashing report which made most startling interruptions.

Probably after the completion of Cecil Rhodes great dream, the railway through Africa the town of the Great Dark Forest will be the supplement to the Cairo-Khartoum excursion.
