Nfld. Newspaper Looks For Long Ice Siege This Spring

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (CP)—A curtain of fog over the sea lifted for brief intervals Thursday to show a field of ice hard against the entrance of St. John's Harbor, waiting to move in at a whim of the wind. Strong easterly winds are behind it, pushing and prodding, but the ice field is huge and the harbor entrance narrow. The situation compares with fitting a jigsaw puzzle into a milk bottle. When the first piece breaks away the rest will follow rapidly. The harbor could be filled in an hour. St. John's is threatened by the end of a ribbon of ice 50 to 100 miles broad pressing hard against the northeast coast and Labrador as far north as Davis Strait. The sea beyond St. John's is filled with ice pans in a floe extending 90 miles from shore. The ice has reached the edge of the Grand Banks south of the province. Westerly winds left Trinity Bay free of ice earlier this week but Thursday it was plugged solid again. Conception Bay was filling rapidly Thursday but the ferry Kipowa operated across the three-mile trickle between Bell Island and Portugal Cove, 10 miles from St. John's. An ice blockade has flurried with the 10,000 people of Bell Island for days past, but with forecast of strong easterly winds for the next two days, isolation appeared certain.

New Zealand Celebrates Historic Anniversary

By J. C. GRAHAM Canadian Press Correspondent AUCKLAND, N. Z. (CP)—New Zealand today celebrated the 75th anniversary of a voyage which had historic results for the country. It established the country's economy on lines which have endured ever since. The voyage was the journey of the clipper ship Dunedin to London taking the first cargo of frozen meat from New Zealand to Britain. Until 1882 New Zealand depended for its export income on wool, hides and tallow. Except for the small amount of meat needed locally, surplus animals were sent to the boiling down works or just left to rot on the farms. The success of the bold experiment of sending frozen meat to the opposite side of the world changed the outlook completely. New Zealand is today the largest meat-exporting country in the world. Shipment of frozen meat was soon followed by the sending of butter and cheese to Britain in the same way. Together meat and dairy produce now account for more than half of New Zealand's export earnings.

CONTRACT BRIDGE

Making the contract is declarer's first consideration. In most hands, the mathematical factors in bridge are such that an over-trick above the contract under taken is insignificant alongside the value of a contract fulfilled. Suppose, as in this instance, the contract is five diamonds. If eleven tricks are made, North South score 700 for the virgin rubber and 100 for the diamond trick value. It would be unwise to jeopardize the 800 points involved and a 100-point penalty for the sake of trying to capture an extra 20 points. The king of clubs is led, following East has Q-x or Q-x-x the ace happens to fall, and the contract is made, but why was the ace played instead of the jack? There is good reason, as we shall know. If West has the queen of clubs a subsequent play towards the jack will be effective. The ace play has not lost the contract. If East has Q-x or Q-x-x the ace play makes the hand also. If East has Q-x-x-x the ace does no harm. The only time declarer loses anything by playing the ace is when West has Q-x-x. But even in this case the contract is not lost, only 20 points.

Pipe Lines Shares Trade At Premium

TORONTO (CP)—Trans-Canada Pipe Lines Ltd. Thursday got its first taste of public trading and was rated at a premium. Units whose issued value is \$150 brought early quotations of \$156 to \$158, advanced to a \$163 to \$165 range, and then retreated to \$160 to \$162. Nesbitt Thomson and Co. Ltd., managers of the country-wide group of investment dealers which handled the issue, described trading as "fairly active," but mostly in small lots ranging from two to 50 units. A unit consists of a \$100 debenture and five shares of common stock with par value of \$10 each. These have been marketed across the country on a subscription basis and Thursday's trading was in shares which original purchasers are willing to part with. Their willingness to part with them depends, of course, on the price offered. The Units are not yet listed on stock exchanges and trading is carried out by various investment houses on an over-the-counter or unlisted basis. Trans-Canada has already started to build a natural-gas pipe line from Alberta to Toronto and Montreal via Northern Ontario.
