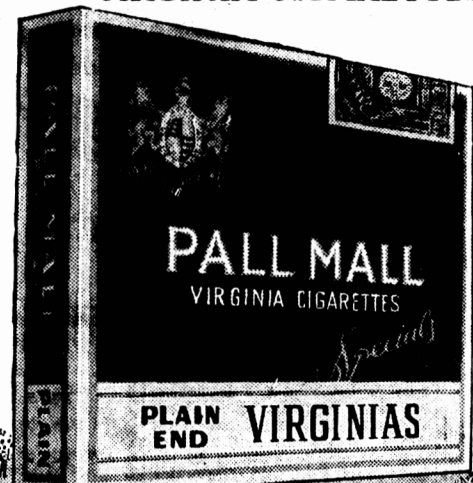

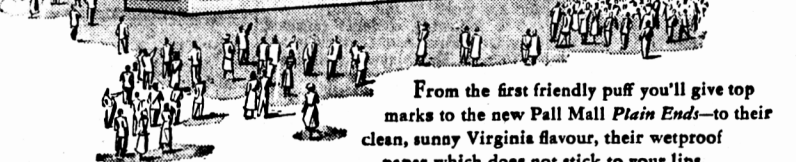

### RELIGION IN RUSSIA

YORK, England, May 24 —(AP)—The Archbishop of York said today freedom in Russia is more religious freedom in Russia than in many of her satellite countries. "It is probable that the Russian Church... has now under Soviet rule as much freedom as it had under the Czars," Archbishop Dr. Cyril F. Garbett told a Church conference. "But in other Communist countries a policy of persecution has been adopted."
