THE CRIMINAL CODE AGAIN.

Judge Hodgson Refuses a Prisoner Bail Until He is Brought Before a County Court Judge.

An application was made this morning at Chambers to the presiding Judge—Mr. Justice Hodgson—for an order to admit to bail a man named Cheever, a prisoner in King's County Jail on a charge of assault. The prisoner was committed for trial since the coming into force of the criminal code. The Sheriff of King's County has not yet notified Judge Hodgson of his commitment, and consequently the man has not been brought before the County Court Judge and made his election whether he desires to be tried before that court or await until the Supreme Court meets next February and take his chances before a jury.

SENATOR FERGUSON'S APPOINTMENT. (Halifax Herald.) It is reported that Hon. Donald Ferguson has been appointed to the Senate in the place of the late Senator Montgomery. We shall be pleased if this report is verified. Mr. Ferguson has enjoyed an experience of eighteen years in the P. E. Island legislature, and for nine years he was a member of the provincial government.

MR. WILLIAM WALKER ASTOR, the new landlord of Cliveden, has made himself heartily unpopular among the frequenters of the Thames by cutting off the privileges of the boatmen of Westminster always allowed to visitors. It has been the custom of river excursionists to take tea on the terrace opposite Cockham Lock, one of the most picturesque spots on the river, and some distance from Cliveden mansion. Mr. Astor has forbidden this, and it is said, he will also stop the privilege of visiting Cliveden woods.

NEWS NOTES. The Fall River cotton mills, which have cut down their production about 90 per cent., give notice of a reduction of wages to operators of from 10 to 15 per cent. The pressure of the crisis is getting down to the base of the industrial pyramid and its weight is heavy.

CRUELTY TO SOLDIERS. The Cause of Many Complaints in the German Army. A late Berlin despatch says: The suicide of a private in a guard's regiment in Potsdam has revived a public discussion of bullying and abuse in the army. The private was a victim of his corporal, whose inhuman practices he described in a note left for his family.

Analyst Best is known to us in his capacity as an expert witness at trials for poisoning before our judicial courts. That he possesses special knowledge of the modern operations of Marsh's test for mineral poisoning I am ready to admit, nor should such special skill be undervalued, albeit the celebration involved in the performance makes but slim returns for exercise upon the higher order of mental faculties, and I say this, because while he may be safely accepted as authority on Marsh's test, it is by no means follows that his opinions on the subject such as the work of the Sanitary Engineer are entitled to any greater weight than that of an intelligent carpenter or ploughman.

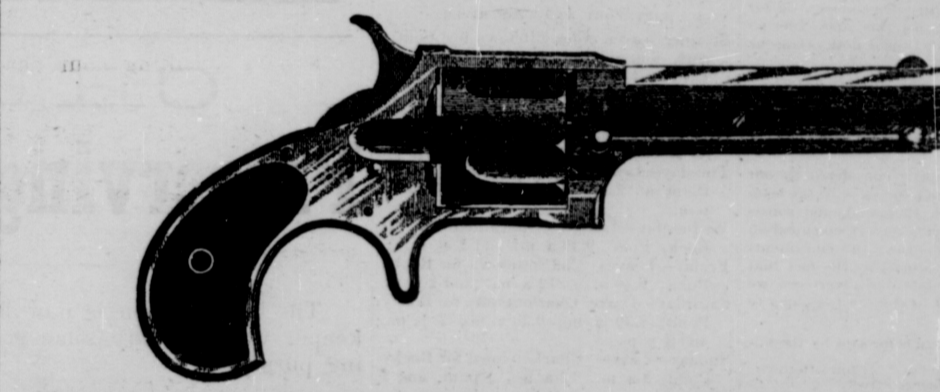
