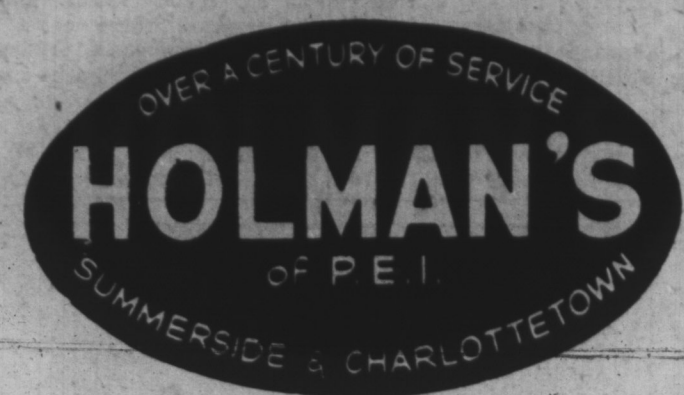


MAN ON MOON

(5) What portion of the total cost is paid by the Federal Government?

### ANSWERS

1. (a) No.
2. The building is being built by the Department of Public Works.
3. See 2 above.
4. \$97,383.49 to end of January, 1959. Estimate \$240,000.00.
5. 50 percent of cost if not exceeding maximum capital allotment available for 5 year period. Expected recovery about one-third.

## Answers To Questions Tabled In Legislature

The Interim Commission on Hospital Insurance has not submitted a report to the Government according to an answer given on the order paper by Health Minister Bonnell in reply to a question asked by Dr. L. G. Dewar (PC-2nd. Prince).

No money has been paid to Mr. Gordon MacDonald of Victoria in lieu of inconvenience caused by the dismantling of the Victoria bridge. This was the answer tabled by Hon. Keir Clark, acting on behalf of Hon. J. George MacKay. The question was asked by Frank Myers (PC 1st. Queens).

Mr. Myers question as to whether any requests had been received from the Village of Victoria requesting the building of a causeway at this point also received a "No" answer from the minister.

### Three Children Die In Que. Fire

VAL MORIN, Que. (CP)—Three children were burned to death Sunday when fire destroyed a private lodge for retarded children in Val Morin, some 50 miles north of Montreal. Another child was badly injured.

The Rowan bank lodge, a two-storey wood-frame structure, was destroyed in the early morning fire.

The dead children were identified as Fernand Bouthillier, 12, Corrida Boucher, 9, and Samuel Clarke, 8.

Mr. and Mrs. Roland Demers were in charge of the Laurentian Mountain Lodge. Owner is Paul Trudel, of Montreal.

Mr. Demers said he was awakened by smoke and by the sounds of the children running about on the roof this morning.

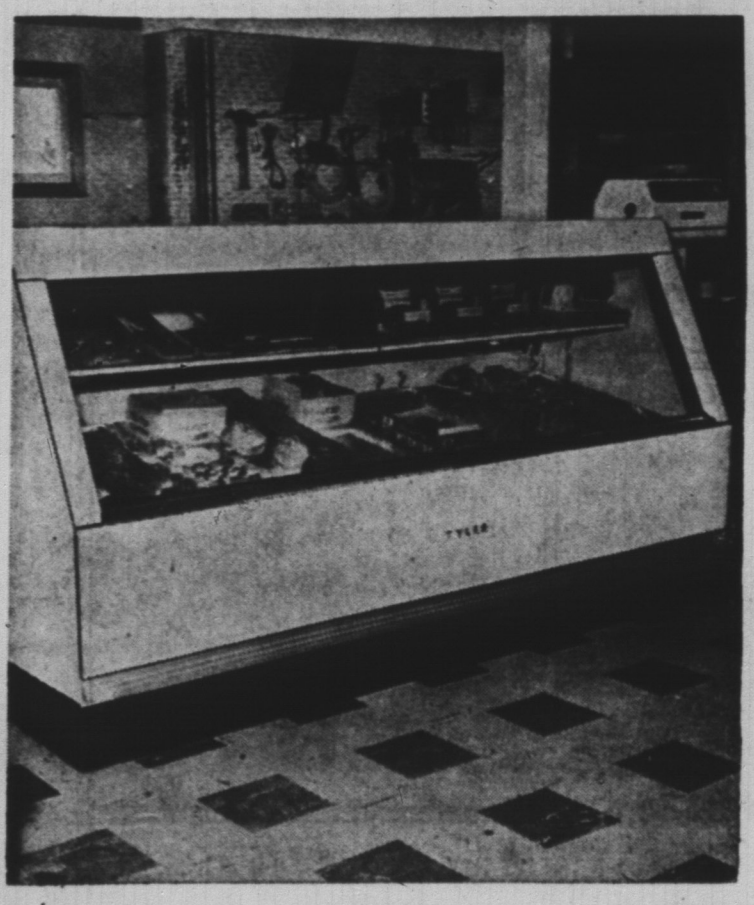

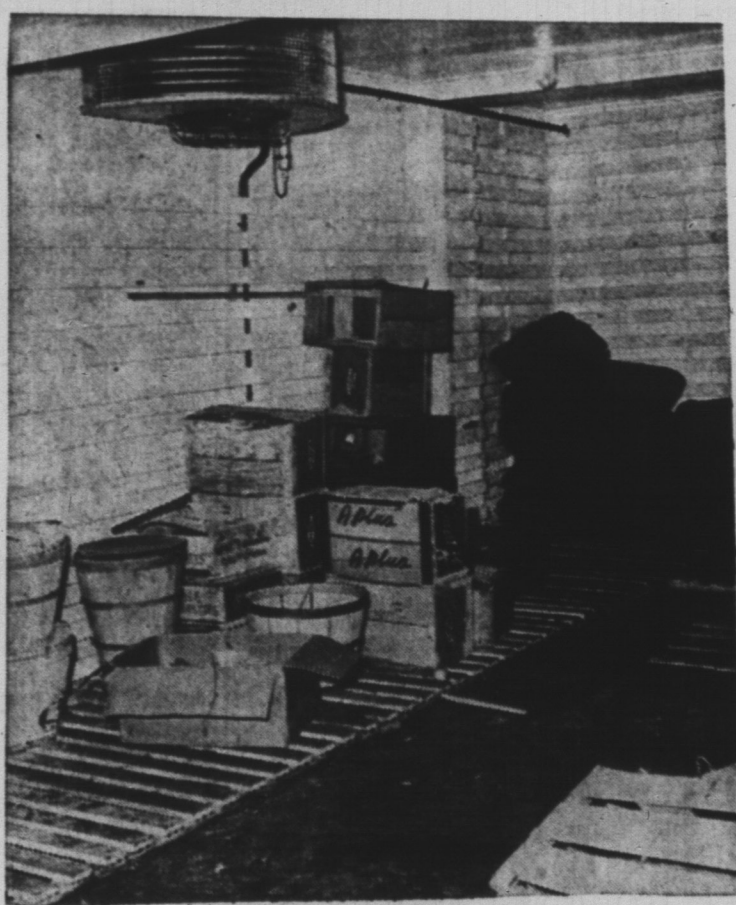

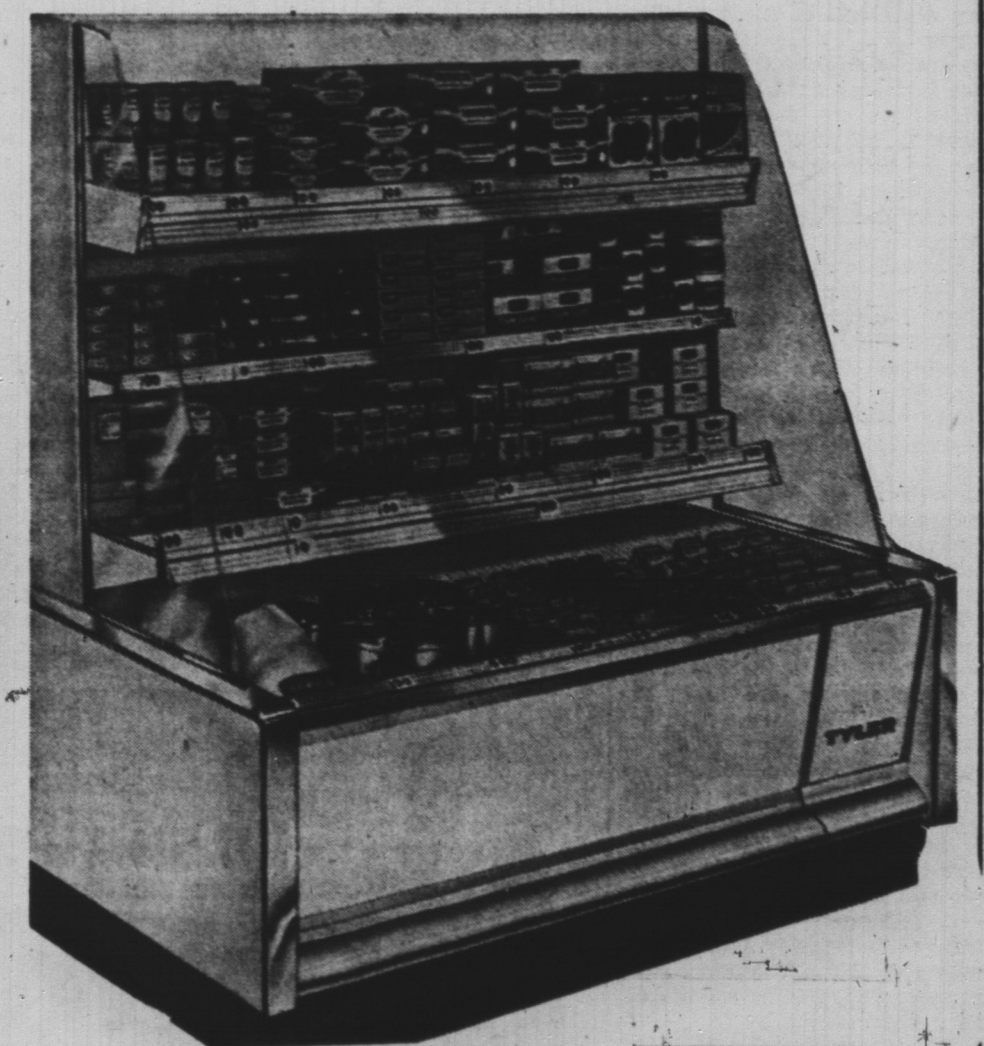
