

Montague Fire Brigade Meets

The regular meeting of the Montague Fire Brigade was held last evening in the Town Hall with the fire chief, Doug Coffin, presiding over the meeting. Following the reading of the minutes of the last meeting, discussion centered on the construction of a dam at the Burnt Bridge at the northern end of the town to provide fire protection at that point. It was decided that every effort should be made to have this dam constructed as soon as possible, and it was thought possible that the Town Council would take this matter under serious consideration at this time.

Fire Chief Coffin explained to the members that at this time of the year fire hazards were in greater proportion due to people burning leaves and other rubbish, and he decided that all residents should be notified that permission from the Fire Chief or the Assistant Fire Chief was necessary before any burning of rubbish should take place.

The annual fireman's ball at Montague was also taken under consideration, and Mr. Gilbert Clements was appointed chairman of a committee to make the necessary arrangements for the holding of this annual affair.

The Fire Chief pointed out that several men had indicated their wish to join the fire brigade, but he pointed out that the brigade had now a full complement of men and as a result it was decided to start a waiting list of those who wish to join the brigade. And those who wish to join will pass in their names to the Fire Chief or the Assistant Fire Chief.

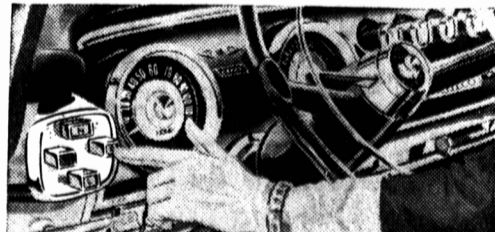

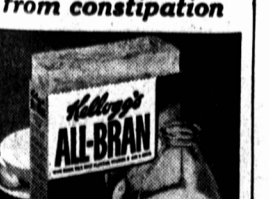
