BENJAMIN COURT

On May 29th the people of Escuminac received a severe shock when the news went forth that Mr. Benjamin Court had passed away in his sleep. The deceased was born in North Rustico, P. E. Island, 81 years ago, and moved to Fleurant, P.Q., along with his father and mother, the late Mr. and Mrs. Charles Court, and the rest of their family, when he was 9 years of age, and later bought a farm on Escuminac Flats, where he engaged in farming and fishing ever since.

But although in his 81st year, judging from his appearance and actions no one would take him to be more than sixty years of age. In fact, he could move around more quickly than lots of men. It was only a few months since his usual good health began to fail and he had to curtail some of his activities.

He was a man of jovial nature, very popular, widely known and will be greatly missed by a host of people, as he was noted for his hospitality and seemed to be in his natural element when entertaining people either old, young or middle-aged.

The funeral was held from his late residence on May 31st and was largely attended as people came from far and near to pay their last tribute to a respected citizen.

He leaves to mourn his loss his wife, nee Bessie Keays, and three sons and two daughters. The sons are Austin, Chester and William of Escuminac; the daughters are Mrs. Robert Keays (Opal) also of Escuminac and Mrs. Lawrence Yaphé (Jean) of Montreal. Seven grandchildren and four great grandchildren also survive him and two brothers and two sisters are left to mourn the loss of their brother, they are George and William of Fleurant, and Mrs. Herman Edwards (Maggie) of Alberta and Mrs. Carol Oakes (Anna) of Maine.

The service at the house and grave was conducted in a very appropriate manner by Rev. J. MacLeod. The hymns sung were "Abide With Me", "Rock of Ages", and "Will Your Anchor Hold".
