Crater's Old Reservoir Ruins Are Discovered

Charlottetown's first reservoir, built in the late 1880's and rededicated recently as plans were being made for the construction of a new one. The old reservoir was located 100 yards to the St. Edward Road where the old stone and cement wall, which surrounded it, still stands. It was an open reservoir, circular, about 100 feet in diameter and was located in the five-foot high wall. However, chairman of the water commission Sidney Green noted that having an open reservoir must have proven unsatisfactory to the commissioners of that day as just 14 years later a new reservoir was built.

The new one was constructed inside the stone wall of the old one. It is 16 feet deep and 118 feet in diameter and was completely covered at the time of building. Several feet of earth were piled on top to keep the water temperature cool. 60 YEARS SERVICE Holding approximately 1,100,000 gallons of water, the system has served the City of Charlottetown for over 60 years.

Inquest Stated tonight Into Four Drownings

SOURIS — During the week-end Kings County coroner Dr. G.S.A. Inman announced that the inquest into the multiple drowning which occurred near Stukely Farm, St. Peter's Bay, last Thursday has been rescheduled from Tuesday evening to this evening.

Members of the jury are: Leonard Anderson, Walter Coffin, James Robbins, Arthur MacKenzie, Norman McSwain and Reginald MacAdam, all of Morrell.

The inquest has been called as the result of four vacationers, Mrs. Jean Lillian Charles, 47, of Toronto, and her young nephew and niece, Philip Dunlop, 11, and Alexander, 10, of Toronto, who were drowned in a swimming accident.

The new reservoir will have a capacity of approximately 2,000,000 gallons and will be 160 feet in diameter with a water depth of 16 feet. Date for the start of construction has not yet been announced by the water commissioners.

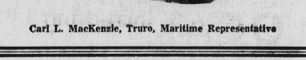
