Speed Train To Newfoundland

MONCTON (CP)—The CNR announced Wednesday that train travelling time between Montreal and St. John's, Nfld. will be cut by 23 hours effective Oct. 27.

The faster service is made possible by introduction of the single-car rail-liner on the Truro-Sydney run and a re-alignment of ferry schedules. It will also cut the travel time between Port aux Basques and St. John's, Nfld. by 30 minutes.

The present Montreal-St. John's trip takes 3 1/2 days and from Port aux Basques to St. John's, nearly 14 hours.
