## The Queens Ascot Dress Is Major Topic Of Society

LONDON (Reuters) — The dresses the Queen and her cousin, Princess Alexandra, wore for Tuesday's opening of the Royal Ascot races became society's major topic today. For they posed the question: Were they the same? Ascot crowds saw the Queen wearing a bright pink and white flowered dress with a pale pink straw hat. The only difference about the 19-year-old princess' outfit seemed to be that her hat was boater-shaped and not made of straw. The Daily Sketch describes the outfits as "similar." The Daily Express gives the same description for both dresses and says the Queen was placed in "a most embarrassing situation." The Express adds: "The Queen's Ascot wardrobe is planned with the minutest care but this is the second year running that someone else has worn a similar dress." Last year it was a member of

the public whose dress, although dissimilar in style, was made of the same material. "Officially, after any dress has been made for the Queen," the remainder of the roll of material is destroyed and never made again," The Express notes.
