To Inaugurate Sound System

OTTAWA (CP)—When Queen Elizabeth reads the speech from the throne Oct. 14 opening the first session of the 23rd Parliament she will be inaugurating the Senate's new sound system.

The system, claimed to be one of the most modern ever installed in a legislative chamber, consists of 55 microphones and 84 loudspeakers, located at points throughout the chamber.

During the session senators will be paired with each pair sharing a microphone - loudspeaker combination unit. When a senator is speaking his microphone will be the only one turned on and the equipment will adjust itself to loud or soft voices so that all voices will be heard at the same volume level.

Was Native Of Souris
