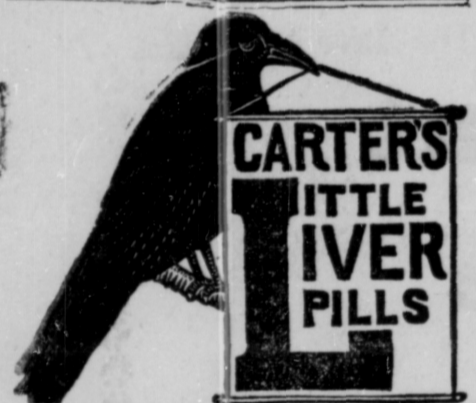

Its Conditions and Its People.

A PROSPEROUS OUTLOOK.

The Scenery and the Cycling.

(Correspondence of THE EXAMINER)

St. Pierre, in addition to its fisheries being the great nursery for the French navy, is widely known among the Customs officials of Newfoundland and the Dominion as a spring and source of very extensive smuggling, chiefly in liquor.

Houses of fishermen are seen scattered along in the little coves, where the children are born, and reared amid the ceaseless wash and moan of the surges of the Atlantic, which is to them a home, a means of subsistence, and too often a grave.

The promontory culminating in the striking headland of Cape Chapeau Rouge with the safe harbor and thriving settlement of St. Lawrence at its base. A little to the west is Lamaline, the birthplace of Sir James Winter, the present premier of Newfoundland, while to the eastward is Burin, the most important settlement on this part of the coast.

The long bright afternoon passed pleasantly as we steamed across the calm waters of Placentia Bay, and it was early evening when we entered the beautiful harbor of Placentia, the old French capital of the Island. Let us quote from Prowse's History a description of the scene that unfolds itself here.

"The situation of Placentia is extremely beautiful and picturesque, the railway from Whitebourne, instead of descending the northeast valley into the ancient French metropolis, by a curious freak of engineering ascends, and forms a lofty height, and from a lofty height the traveler sees the whole panorama of Plaisance spread out before him; below is the beautiful northeast arm dotted with islands, cottages and farms, beyond is the shining sea, the beach and the town with its beautiful Catholic chapel and houses.

shifting its position very much as it does when travelling on our own railway whence we infer that curves are not unknown in Newfoundland railway building. Perhaps they desire to show off the scenery to the greatest possible advantage, their necessarily heavy grades furnish a better excuse than is possible in our own Island.

Little change has taken place in the city since our last visit, a few more buildings have been erected and very few of the gaps made by the fire of 1892 now remain. The burnt district has been greatly improved in rebuilding. In the first of a series of letters now being published in the Montreal Star by the talented Principal of Queen's College, Kingston, Dr. Grant, who was one of our fellow passengers on the return trip, we note that he speaks in the highest terms of the roads as affording splendid facilities for bicycles.

It was easy to believe that anyone riding down a Newfoundland hill would have a somewhat pained expression, for the consequence of meeting any obstacle would be most serious. Then there is the continual danger of collisions, for the sidewalks are all over the street, and as the foot passenger has the right of way everywhere, cyclists are compelled to ride warily and keep ringing their bells all the time.

Despite the good system of sewerage and the various admirable sanitary measures adopted, a good deal remains to be done before the city is all that could be desired. In many parts of the city water is thrown into the surface drains and through it soon finds its way into the sewers.

The country around the capital is pretty, and it was looking its very best, and the crops (which of course does not convey the idea that they do to us) were promising splendidly. The potatoes especially looked well, the waters of Cabot's Strait being wide enough, so far at all events, to keep out the bu.
