Will Install Auxiliary Tank On Fire Truck

Fire Chief D.H. Coffin presided at the regular meeting of the Montague Fire Department held in the Town Hall Monday night. It was decided that a 200-gal. auxiliary water tank would be installed on the chemical truck to provide water for re-filling the chemical.

It was announced that the equipment for the installation of buzzers was a hand and immediate steps would be taken to have them installed in the homes of the firemen. It was felt that the blowing of sirens over the radio was leading to some confusion, and the Secretary was instructed to write Radio Station C.F.C.Y. to see if this could be eliminated.

Although hoping that no serious swimming fatality would occur this summer, the department felt that they should be prepared for any eventuality, and have decided to order three grappling irons so that they may be on hand if required. It was also decided to hold an instruction period on Artificial Respiration, Monday night, April 23rd, at the town hall to which everyone would be invited to attend. A new member was placed on the Department strength to replace a member who is employed in Charlottetown.

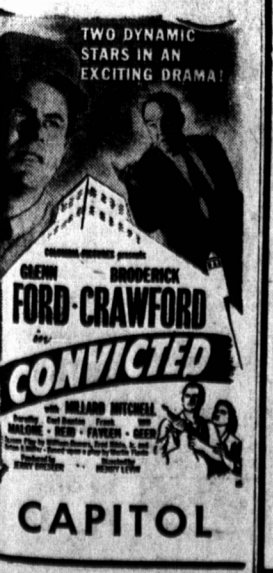
