Montreal Boy Awarded Damages
MONTREAL, Nov. 27 (CP)—The psychological effects resulting from disfigurement of a boy's face were recognized in a Superior Court judgment Wednesday.
The court allowed an item claim of \$1,800 in the action taken by Hector Campbell Armour in behalf of his seven-year-old son. The boy carries a scar as the result of a brush with an automobile.
Other items in the claim brought the court's award to \$3,077.65 against Stephen Hines, owner of the car.
Mr. Justice George S. Chailles recalled that the boy had told him in court that other children called him such names as "pimple face."

Agree To Keep Peace In Antarctica

LONDON, Nov. 27 (Reuters)—Britain, Argentina and Chile Wednesday renewed their agreement not to send warships into Antarctica apart from "customary movements" during the coming polar spring and summer.
They did so "to avoid any misunderstanding in Antarctica which may affect the friendly relations, statements exchange among the three and issued Wednesday in London said.
Both Chile and Argentina lay claim to parts of the British Falkland Islands in the Antarctic.
