

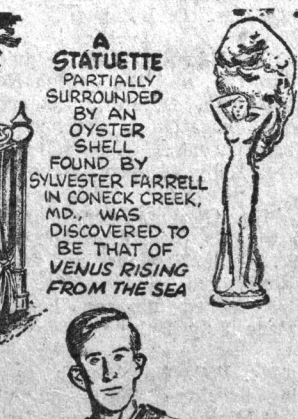

The bidding:  
South West North East  
Pass 1♣ 2♥ Pass

wasn't difficult for East to read his partner had led a singleton. Both the bidding and the lead indicated West had only one club.

But instead of impulsively returning a club for West to ruff, which would have permitted declarer to make the hand, East gave thought to where the setting trick would come from.

It was clear on the bidding that South could not have a six card trump suit or he would have rebid the suit earlier. Therefore West was marked with at least two spades. The ruff could consequently be postponed, since West's spades could not be drawn while East had the ace of trump. The setting trick, if West had it, could consist of the ace of hearts. If West had an ace the contract would be defeated regardless of what East returned; but if West had the king of hearts a club return would be useless since the heart king would never score. Dummy's clubs would eventually take care of South's heart losers if West were given an immediate club ruff.

So East led a heart, declarer finessed, and West took the king. He returned a heart won in dummy.

Declarer led the ten of spades. East didn't wait. He grabbed the ace, returned a club, and West ruffed for the setting trick.

And West, unaware of East's brilliant defense, said indignantly to East: "Why didn't you give me the club ruff right away? Didn't you know I opened a singleton?"

**Bank Policy Said Keeping Bond Market On The Jump**

OTTAWA (CP) — Recent Bank of Canada manoeuvring in the Canadian bond market has raised a stir among bond dealers. Some expressed declining confidence today in federal financing methods.

Cause of the uproar was what some dealers described as the central bank's failure to step in and support the bond market and prevent a sharp slump in the price of long-term government bonds.

However, federal authorities argued it wasn't the business of the central bank to stabilize the bond market. But it did act through its buying and selling policies to iron out sharp swings in bond prices.

The bank-dealer rupture appeared to have developed from two sources: The declining market in the United States as well as Finance Minister Fleming's June 17 budget announcement that he plans to raise an unprecedented \$3,400,000,000 in bonds this year.

**Praises Work Of Champlain**

QUEBEC (CP) — Unity and peace are the great lessons that emerge from the work of French explorer Samuel de Champlain, Prime Minister Diefenbaker said Thursday night.

They were still vital necessities today to assure Canada's national unity, Mr. Diefenbaker said in French, addressing a banquet commemorating the 350th anniversary of Champlain's founding of Quebec, in 1608.

"Champlain put his imprint upon the North American continent, from Newfoundland to the Rocky Mountains, from Hudson Bay to the Gulf of Mexico. Champlain's ambition was to see born beyond the Atlantic a new world in which occidental culture might flourish. That is why we must render homage to the courage, the Christian spirit and the patriotism of the man rightly considered to be one of Canada's founders," Mr. Diefenbaker said.

The text of the prime minister's speech was released to the press in advance of delivery.

**Soldier Settler Requires Credit**

OTTAWA (CP) — The average soldier settler needs more credit to get his farm on an economic basis, and should emphasize fruit and livestock crops rather than cereals, a Parliamentary committee was told Thursday.

Brig. T. G. Rutherford, director of soldier settlement and of the Veterans' Land Act administration, gave the Commons veterans affairs committee preliminary results of a survey now under way.

Results, based on analysis of 3,000 soldier settlers, of the 75,301 who had benefited under the act to March 31, showed that the average farmer needs credit amounting to \$9,823 to put his unit on an economic basis.
