

# Accentuated Bosoms Surprise Fashion Note

PARIS (AP)—During accentuation of midday's bosom by Dior was a spicy surprise Thursday at Paris' high couture showings.

The new bosom line—high and belted—was designed by Dior's Marc 'Johan for cocktail and evening wear. For daytime, Bosoms were more conventional with necklines.

Hemlines were left unchanged at knee level for day wear.

Bohan's new look for bosoms dropped the necklines to daring levels. Bosoms flattened and elated—bulged seductively.

The waist for cocktail and evening wear was marked just below the rounded, strapped bosoms which in many creases almost emerged from bodices.

The high waist produced an elongated torso in the shift and chemise creations for evening wear.

**NO LOUD APPLAUSE**  
However, there was none of the loud applause usually heard at a Dior opening. While most of the fashion experts crowding into the elegant Dior salons considered the creations a technical success, many felt they were far short of the bombshell qualities of the late 1950s.

For daytime, Dior told a restrained stunning story in tweeds and oversize checked plaids. Classic suits were revived. Marvelous roomy topcoats dress-length, one-button, or three-button length had heavy shoulders derived from the renaisance. Others had straight skirts. Cleves.

Hand-picked colors were featured with the hand-loomed colonial rug look. Bohan said he prefers to blend his colors rather than contrast them in daytime street wear. Old rose and grey tweed topped a grey flared dress, and brown and orange tweed had a brown or orange dress.

The short belted tunic worn with a skirt pleated at the four cardinal points is his big theme. Others have straight skirts. Classic tailored jackets with a vented back panel top these two nice suits.
