Edmonton Oil Kings Club Sick Of Being Bridesmaid

By JOHN SHORT EDMONTON (CP) — Edmonton Oil Kings are sick and tired of being humiliated in Memorial Cup finals, says Clarence Moher, chief western scout of the parent Detroit Red Wings.

Kings, who meet Oshawa Generals tonight in the first game of the 1966 Canadian junior final, have represented the West six previous times in a row and have won only once—in 1963.

Moher, who plans to fly today to Toronto, refused to make a prediction on the outcome.

"I think it's a better club this year," Moher said Tuesday. He mentioned the added experience and the acknowledged talents of defencemen Bob Falkenberg and Al Hamilton, centre Ross Perkins and right winger Ron Anderson.

WAS IMPRESSIVE Hamilton impressed everybody during a four-game stint with New York Rangers of the National Hockey League and Falkenberg and Anderson played well in brief trials with Memphis Red Wings of the Central Professional League.

Hot Words Fly As Teams Prepare For Memorial Cup TORONTO (CP)—Hot words are starting to fly, as usual, on the eve of a Memorial Cup final playoff.

Hot Words Fly (continued) The teams clash tonight at 8 p.m. EDT at Maple Leaf Gardens in the first game of a best-of-seven series for the Canadian junior hockey championship.

Hot Words Fly (continued) All games of the series will be played at the 15,000-seat Gardens, with the second game slated for Friday, the third Sunday and the fourth next Wednesday. Other dates if the series is extended, are May 14-15-17.

Hot Words Fly (continued) Oshawa's rink, where the series would have been played, will be taken up for the next two weeks with a sportsmen's show and a religious rally, which booked for the arena several months ago.

Hot Words Fly (continued) About 4,000 tickets went on sale this week in Oshawa for the opener. When Blair, the team's general manager, said Tuesday ticket sales have been brisk.

Hot Words Fly (continued) Kings' major weakness has been at left wing this season. Ron Lonsberry and Jim Harrison of Estevan Bruins have been added to fill the gap. Anderson missed several playoff games with an ailing knee, so Oil Kings' manager Bill Hunter picked up Ted (Chief) Hodgson from Estevan as a standby.
