# Reggie Hughes Leading Batter In Junior League; Carson Leading Pitcher

Reggie Hughes, shortstop for the City Junior Baseball League winners, the Knights of Columbus, was acclaimed the League's leading batter, according to statistics compiled by the Guardian Sports Department. Hughes won the title by a fraction of a percentage point from Jackie Cairns, shortstop-pitcher for the Kinsmen.

Hughes had 18 hits in 47 times at bat for a .340 average while Cairns garnered 18 hits in 53 times at bat for an average of .339. Arnold McCallum, Vics catcher, was third with .320 with Cliff Ready, another Vics, next with .314. John MacDougall, Kinsmen catcher, was fifth with .308.

Those five rounded out the three hundred hitters in the league who had appeared at the plate in the required thirty-five times at bat. Billy Leonard had the highest average of the league, .370, but he had only 27 times at bat which was eight short of the required number of trips to the plate.

Lorrie Hennessey, second sacker for the Knights, was close to the charmed 300 circle with an average of .291.

Cairns had the most hits, eighteen, while MacDougall had the most doubles, 3, and Gus Flynn of the Vics had the most triples, four. Four players had a home run each. Merlin MacKenzie and Donnie MacLean of the Knights, Art Hughes of the Vics and Charlie Kennedy of the Kinsmen.

Reggie and Art Hughes had the most runs scored while McCallum led the league in runs batted in and total bases, having 12 and 24 respectively in these departments. Lorrie Hennessey led the league in stolen bases with thirteen swipes.

### PITCHING STATISTICS

Benny Carson, slim portsider of the third place Kinsmen, was the leading pitcher of the league with a record of six wins and four losses. Donnie MacLean of the Knights had a perfect record of two wins and no losses while Cliff Ready of the Vics had a four and two record.

Carson appeared in thirteen games and pitched the most innings. He was on the receiving end of ten decisions in these thirteen games and worked a total of 78 innings. He struck out the most batters in the league, 91, and walked 22.

MacLean only worked 11 and 1-3 innings in four games, striking out sixteen and walking six. Cliff Ready pitched 41 2-3 innings, whiffing 23 and walking but nine. Jackie Burke, last year's leading pitcher, had a three and three record while striking out 51 batters in 41 and 2-3 innings. He walked 18.

## Agree On Defence Force For Europe

NEW YORK, Sept. 28—(AP)—The North Atlantic Treaty Council agreed upon establishing at the earliest possible date a combined force for the defence of Western Europe and in effect told its defence committee to settle the question of using German manpower.

The 12-member council issued a communique tonight at the conclusion of a series of talks here. The communique laid down the following principles:

1. A combined force will be organized under the North Atlantic Treaty Organization and will be subject to political and strategic guidance exercised by the appropriate agencies of that organization.
2. The force will be under a supreme commander who will have sufficient delegated authority to insure that national units allocated to his command are organized and trained into an effective integrated force in time of peace as well as in war.
3. The supreme commander will be supported by an international staff representing all countries contributing to the force.
4. Pending appointment of a supreme commander, there is to be appointed a chief of staff who will have responsibility for training and organization of the force.
5. The standing group of the military committee of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization will be responsible for higher strategic direction of the integrated force.

On the question of creating German military units for use in a combined force the Council decided to request its defence committee, made up of the Defence Ministers, to study the problem and make recommendations at the earliest possible date on the most useful way in which German manpower can be used.

## Pay For Soldiers In Special Force

OTTAWA, Sept. 28—(CP)—The army said pay arrangements for the special United Nations force work out so that the wife of a private with children gets, by

automatic assignment, more than 70 per cent of his total pay.

A spokesman said arrangements for married men in the force come under two headings, one covering those with no children and the other those with children.

The system works this way: A married private gets a total of \$141 a month. Of this his wife gets \$94 and he gets \$47 if they

have no children. If they have children, regardless of number, she gets \$103 of the \$141. He gets the remainder of \$38. If he wants to give her part of that \$38 he can

A married sergeant gets \$176, of which \$100 goes to his wife if they have no children. If they have children he gets \$51, she gets \$125.

Those are examples of the pay rates for the majority of the men in the force.
