NEWS BY TELEGRAPH.

Special Dispatch to the Examiner.

OTTAWA, March 30.

The writ for Chateaugay has been issued. Nomination on April 10th; polling on 17th. The *Citizen* this morning wants to know why Mr. Blake does not come to the front and take Mr. Holton's vacant chair. It says that Mr. Mackenzie desires to resign the leadership, but Mr. Blake will not take it. It also says the budget debate will close at a late hour to-night, with general reply from Mr. Tilley. The general impression is that the debate will take another day after to-day.

In addition to the claim for a share of the Fishery Award the P. E. Island Government last year presented claims against the Dominion Government for maintenance of convicts, also for money expended providing for small-pox patients claiming on these accounts and for jail improvements, at Cû'town, \$54,000. The claim was referred to Inspector Moylan, who submitted an award of \$16,536 in favor of the Island Government. The claim for the extra jail accommodation is not allowed. Moylan's award has been submitted to the Island Government for approval or rejection.

LISBON, March 30.

The Norwegian barque "Ellen," from Philadelphia, has landed the crew of the barque "Star of the West," from New York for Dublin, abandoned at sea.

DUBLIN, March 30.

At a meeting of the Home Rule League on Monday a resolution was passed declaring that the treatment of Parnell at Ennisorthy, by a hired mob, reflected the deepest disgrace on O'Clery and all who took part in the outrage.

ST. PETERSBURG, March 30.

A despatch says that in Court circles every allusion to France is studiously avoided, so clear is the displeasure at her treatment of the Hartmann case.

In an interview yesterday at St. Petersburg, Count Orloff said that Russia will probably send a diplomatic note to France relative to the release of Hartmann, and this would allay excitement in Russia.

Orloff will soon return to Paris. The health of the Czarina is seriously declining. There will be a meeting between the Emperor William and the Czar in a few days.
