

Air Show Slated To Kickoff At 3

The Air Show at Summerside Air Force Day will begin at 3:00 p.m. Saturday with a high speed pass by a CF-101B Voodoo. A low speed pass will follow, breaking into a vertical climb at full speed with afterburner lit.

Three Argus aircraft will then take off, followed by four Neptunes. The last Neptune will do a display of various manoeuvres over the field.

The Albatross search and rescue amphibion will take off next to demonstrate the capabilities which make it an effective rescue aircraft. A search and rescue helicopter will follow, showing off its hovering ability and, if the wind is light, dropping rescue paratroopers to the field.

After the copter lands, an Argus formation will cross the stage, followed by Neptunes. The first formation will break up, with one Argus doing a two-engine flypast behind the Neptunes. The second Argus will demonstrate a slow speed run on all four engines.

Commonwealth Still Strong Despite Gloomy Predictions

LONDON (CP)—Once again the Commonwealth comes bouncing off the ropes, breathing a little harder after some roundhouse swings but apparently as resilient as ever, if not more so.

After all the doleful reports that preceded the 13th meeting of prime ministers — including

THE RED KNIGHT CLIMBS INTO HIS FLASHING JET

Red Knight Is Highlight Of Saturday's Great Show

Highlight of the air show at Summerside this Saturday will be the breathtaking display of the Red Knight. In his scarlet T-33, the Red Knight will perform manoeuvres near the crowd that have thrilled thousands over the years.

A new display has been planned this year, making the show more exciting than ever.

The Red Knight originated at RCAF Station Portage La Prairie, Manitoba, in 1959 as Training Command's contribution to

the 50th anniversary of powered flight in Canada.

The Red Knight was named after Germany's famous World War I ace, the Baron Von Richthofen, whose daring solo air fighting exploits in his famous red biplane earned him the title "The Red Knight of Germany."

Canada's Red Knight has a thrilled millions across Canada and the United States with his spectacular solo display of precision aerobatics with his flash-

ing red T33.

One of the outstanding aspects of the demonstration is the ability of the Red Knight to confine his routine to the display area in spite of the relatively high speed. This year, Flying Officer, Bill Slaughter, the Red Knight, is being seen at major air shows across Canada.

Bill joined the RCAF in September 1957 and was trained at Centralia, Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan and Gimli, Manitoba. After receiving his wings in 1958 he was transferred to Geopline, France where he flew Sabres with 421 Squadron. This Squadron is part of Canada's contribution to the NATO forces in Europe.

While with 421 Squadron Bill was forced to eject from his Sabre, and now wears the coveted Gold Caterpillar pin. This pin is presented to those who have been forced to abandon their aircraft and owe their lives to their parachute.

In 1962 Bill was transferred to Portage La Prairie as a flying instructor and later became unit test pilot. He was selected as 1964 Red Knight and will perform the famous solo aerobatic display across Canada which has become synonymous with the name Red Knight.

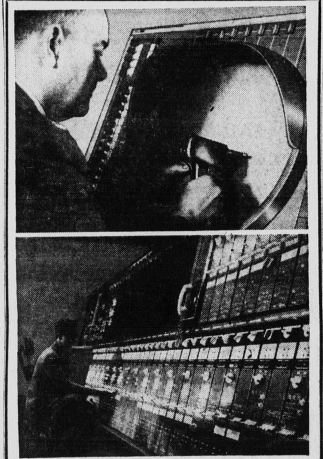

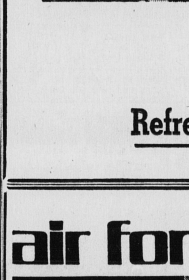
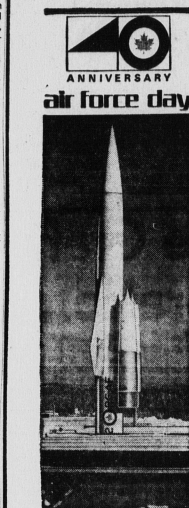
