Auto Production Cutbacks Have New Repercussions

TORONTO (CP) — Repercussions of production cutbacks in the Canadian automobile industry were heard in the Ontario legislature's select committee on labor Tuesday.

George Burt, Canadian director of the United Automobile Workers (UAW), described employment layoffs due to the cutbacks as a "strike by the manufacturers against the government to get some tax concessions."

At the same time Mr. Burt told the committee his union was backing management in its efforts to have the tax cut. Press reports last week said there would be a cut in the excise tax to five from 10 per cent.

Donald Macdonald, Ontario C.P.F. leader, asked Mr. Burt for his opinion of the layoffs. Mr. Macdonald said the manufacturers broke their contracts with the union by fulfilling workers.

"We've always been against this luxury tax on cars, but even with the cut the price of cars will still be too high," Mr. Burt said.

"The companies should match the tax cut with an equal cut of their own and more people would be able to buy cars."

Windor city council passed a resolution Monday asking the federal government to make an announcement on the excise tax situation. The resolution was sent to councils at Oakville and Oshawa for support.

THREE CENTRES HIT

These are the three centres hit by the layoff of auto workers. In Windsor, Chrysler Corporation of Canada laid off 4,000 men for four days. Ford of Canada laid off 4,500 for Monday only but said this layoff was not connected with tax - cut rumors. Another 1,000 Ford workers will be laid off Thursday for an indefinite period. The Ford plants are at Oakville and Windsor.

Break, Entry Case Begins In S'Side Court

The preliminary hearing of a Borden man charged with attempted break, entry and theft from the retail vendors store in Borden on the night of November 15th commenced last evening in the Court House, Summerside and at the completion of the case for the Crown was adjourned until this morning.

Mr. Neil R. MacLeod was attorney for the Crown and Mr. George MacMahon, was counsel for the accused.
