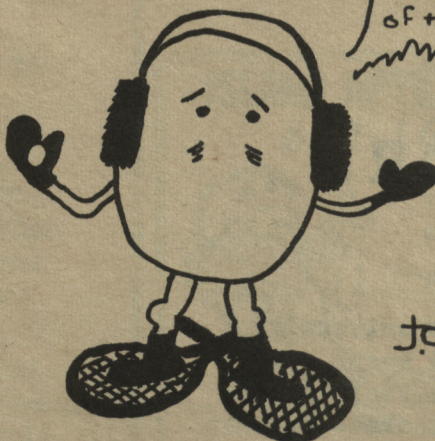
for through tuition, Union
