Maathon Hag Tears Five Members Radical Changes Are Proposed In Parliament Working Schedule

OTTAWA (CP)—Radical changes in Parliament's working schedule were proposed to the Commons Monday to ensure MPs a week in their constituencies for every four weeks in the capital through most of the session.

Among the major recommendations: public accounts; crown corporations; delegated legislation; private bills.

Speaker Alan Macnaughton has proposed a procedural wrangle, just minutes away from a closure deadline in the Commons early today to stage another vote.

\$70,000 In Tax Revenue Seen From New Centre

Deputy-Mayor Walter Cox has announced plans for a \$1,125,000 shopping centre, to be built in the area bordered by Upper Queen, Connelly and Pond Streets.
