

Candidates Accepted For Chefs' Day Course

Southport Man Pleads Guilty To Escaping Jail

John Joseph Alexander Thomas, Southport, pleaded guilty to escaping custody in Queens County Jail where he had been serving a sentence for theft, and was remanded to Feb. 5 for sentencing by James B. Johnson, Q.C., in Queens County magistrate court yesterday.

Thomas, an Indian in his late 80s, escaped from the jail on the afternoon of Aug. 20, 1963. Jail warden knew that someone was missing but Thomas wasn't identified until lockup time.

Within 36 hours photos of the missing prisoner were supplied to all detachments of the RCMP, but it wasn't until Jan. 24, 1964, that he was picked up at the Montreal airport when he disembarked from a plane. It is reported that he was spotted in Chicago, where he boarded the plane, and the news of his arrest was wired ahead to Montreal where the RCMP were waiting when he arrived.

He had appeared in city police court early in August, charged with possession of stolen goods of types reported as coming from a local business house and had been committed for trial in Supreme Court.

Three Injured In Collision

A 1962 car in the accident was involved by Everitt's 1959 vehicle, which was driven by Mr. Murphy. The MacLeod car was proceeding out of Borden at the time the Murphy car was travelling from the Cape Traverse road en route to Carleton.

Mr. MacLeod escaped injury and occupants of the other car were taken home and later removed to hospital.

Apprentices Set For Exams

On Feb. 28 at 2 p.m. trade qualification examinations in carpentry, plumbing and heavy duty mechanics will be conducted at the Vocational Institute, Charlottetown.

W. S. McMurtry, director of apprenticeship, said recently, that to qualify for the exams the applicant must have served four years in his trade as a registered apprentice or learner. He added that the apprenticeship scheme has only been in effect in P. E. I. for two years.

Those passing the exams will obtain a journeyman's certificate. Mr. McMurtry noted that these exams are set to a national standard.

About 100 apprentices are expected to take the set of exams with another 100 writing in March on several trades not included in this group of exams.

Ch'town Native Dies In Ottawa

Ms. Anita M. Carson, a native of Charlottetown, died in Ottawa, Saturday, Feb. 1, after an illness of several months.

Formerly Anita Marguerite Young, she was the last surviving member of a well-known Charlottetown family who moved to Ottawa in 1914.

She was the daughter of the first World War. Her father, John W. Young, born in Earnshaw, P.E.I., was a teacher in West Kent School, Charlottetown, and served in the military. She was the former Miss Laura B. Burke of Charlottetown.

One of her three brothers who predeceased her, P. Lorne Young was for a number of years editor of the Charlottetown Guardian, and at his retirement was the assistant secretary of the National Revenue (Customs Division) in the federal government.

Earl C. Young was the editor of debates in the House of Commons. Her younger brother, Ralph Young, died as a youth, and her sister, Elvira, a translator in the secretary of state department, predeceased her in 1947.

In 1928 the married G.D.B. Currie of Ottawa, who died in 1948, and in 1950 she married Frank H. Carson, a teacher in Ottawa, who died in 1957. She has lived in Ottawa. The funeral was held Feb. 1 from St. George's Anglican church, Ottawa.

She leaves to mourn seven nieces and nephews, the children of Lorne and Earl Young.
