Under the inter-league trading rule, now in its fourth year, a player doesn't have to be traded through the waiver mill by clubs in his own league.

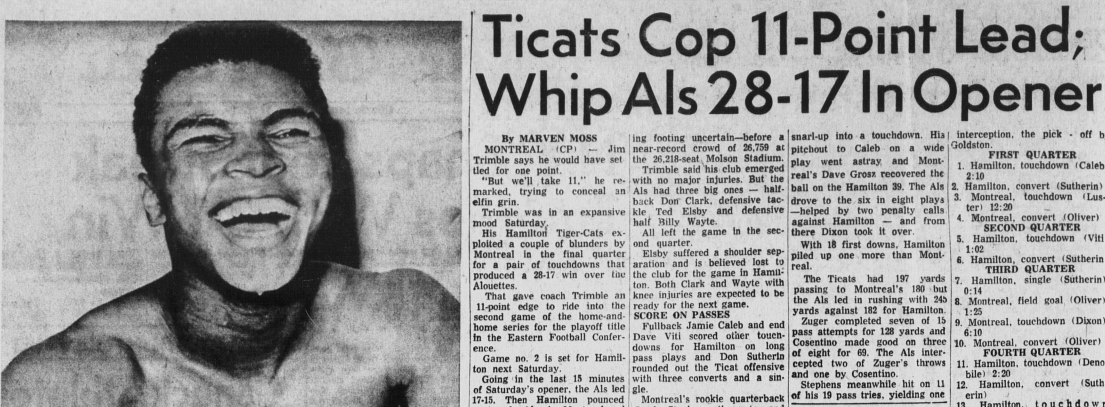
Sensitive Wins Fox Handicap
