### No Direct Government Loans In Sight For Small Firms

OTTAWA (CP) — The government will shortly provide small businesses with technical assistance but no direct loans, it was learned Wednesday.  
The reluctance to provide federal credit may be a blow to retailers. They had urged the administration to set up some form of federal credit facility to help the corner store compete more effectively against the big chains and supermarkets for the customer's dollars.  
The government is known to be sympathetic with the retailers' views but experts feel the development of some new form of federal credit facility or agency for small businesses would raise many complications.  
So, initially, the plan is to set

## One N.B. Blaze Out Of Control

BATHURST, N.B. (CP) — One forest fire was reported "licked" and another still raging out of control north of the Tabusintac River and east of the Chatham-Bathurst highway in northeastern New Brunswick late Wednesday.

A jump fire on the south side of the Tabusintac where the blaze had leaped the 100 foot stream and entered Northumberland County was considered "safe" but another on the north side of the river was fanning out to the west due to a change in wind direction.  
Firefighting crews were on the job from Newcastle, Bathurst and Tracadie. An estimated 200 to 225 men were engaged, about 15 supervisors of the New Brunswick Forest Service and the remainder — farmers, settlers and residents — hired by the lands and mines department.  
Skies Wednesday were overcast but the promise of rain was unfulfilled. Forest service officials said the forecast for today was not hopeful. It indicated warm, sunny weather.

**NO HOMES THREATENED**  
At present no homes or communities are threatened. Daulnay, a settlement of about 150 people is the closest and lies about 10 miles west of the core of the blaze.  
Since beating the Northumberland County fire, Newcastle firefighters have joined forces with others from Bathurst and Tracadie. Wednesday bulldozers were dredging fire ditches around the perimeter of the blaze.  
The burning timberland is mostly spruce and jackpine. Some has been burned over in previous fires and some is only brush and rubble because of lumbering operations in the area.  
Winds were reported late Wednesday travelling southeast at 20 miles an hour. Tuesday it was blowing southwest at 15 to 20 miles an hour. The change in direction resulted in a lengthening of the firefighting front.  
The change was not sufficient to head it toward Daulnay and surrounding farms to the west. Officials said the blaze was the worst this season. The first one broke out May 20 at St. Sauveur about 24 miles east of Bathurst and was quickly controlled. The first of the 1957 season occurred May 12.

### Says Information Good From Oil Well At Wellington

The question of whether there is oil or gas on Prince Edward Island should definitely be answered following exhaustive geological tests now being carried out, Mr. B. Graham Rogers told the Alberton and West Prince Board of Trade at their regular meeting last night.  
The history of the search for oil and other minerals on the Island was traced by the speaker from the year 1845 to the present day.  
He said Prince Edward Island is divided into equal sections and licenses granted to interested oil companies. The California Standard Oil Company is scheduled to start a survey in Western Prince County right away.  
As all mineral rights are vested in the Government, the Province stands to benefit as much as the oil companies if oil is discovered.  
During a most interesting lecture on the mineral formations of P. E. I. Mr. Rogers stated that contrary to popular belief that the Island is comparatively new, fossils found in the Miminogash area were found by experts to be at least 350 million years old.  
Information from Imperial Wellington No. 1 is so good, he said, that other wells will be drilled even if No. 1 is a dry well.  
Dr. L. G. Dewar moved a vote of thanks to the speaker for coming from Charlottetown to address the meeting.  
Mr. Rogers is Transportation Minister with the Dept. of Industry and Natural Resources.
