

20 'Dangerous Criminals' Escape Prison With Arms

 IVY BLUFF, N. C. (AP)—Twenty dangerous criminals—heavily armed and at least four of them killers—broke out of the Ivy Bluff prison for incorrigibles Tuesday.

Six guards were overpowered and left locked up. The convicts had eight rifles, eight pistols and a sub-machine-gun.

Despite a huge manhunt centering in North Carolina and Virginia, only one of the convicts had been captured by late in the day.

A posse, following a bloodhound, captured Charlie Edwards 28, a Negro serving a life term, about eight miles south of the prison.

Ivy Bluff is situated in an isolated area five miles north of Yanceyville, N.C., about 65 miles northwest of Raleigh and some seven miles south of the Virginia border.

LIFE-TERMS
 Six of the prisoners were serving life terms for such crimes as murder, rape and kidnapping.

Ivy Bluff, normally housing about 40 convicts, is used only for the state's worst prisoners.

State prisons director William F. Bailey has described them as "incorrigible hardened criminals—the type you find in Alcatraz."

Bailey fired two guards, one a 35-year man, for laxity.

The escape apparently was engineered by Charles (Yank) Stewart, 52, serving 25 years for armed robbery, and James Christy, 26, serving 19 to 25 years for breaking and entering and manslaughter.

USED HACKSAWS
 Bailey said they apparently used smuggled hacksaws to cut their way out of isolation cells on the top floor of the two-story brick building. Six other men also were in the isolation cells. The other prisoners were in two first-floor cellblocks, one for whites and the other for Negroes. Six of the escapees are Negroes.

Shocking Events Are Not Seen In Red Dominated Hungary

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (CP) Canada told the United Nations Tuesday there is "reason to believe, or at least to suspect, that new and shocking events may have taken place in recent months" in Communist Hungary.

Wallace B. Nesbitt, vice-chairman of the Canadian delegation, appealed directly to the Hungarian government to clear away "angry suspicion" by co-operating with the UN or some other agency, such as the Red Cross. Addressing the 14th General Assembly, Nesbitt referred in particular to reports that teenagers involved in the Hungarian uprising of 1956 had been held for execution until they reached the age of 16.

As Nesbitt spoke, the University of British Columbia student council sent a petition, signed by 20,000 Canadian university students, to Sir Leslie Munro of New Zealand, special UN representative on Hungary.

STUDENT PLEA
 The petition asked support in an effort to save the lives of 150 Hungarian students allegedly awaiting execution in Hungary for their part in the 1956 rebellion, which was crushed by Soviet tanks.

Said Nesbitt: "In my government's opinion, the only way the government of Hungary could possibly satisfy sympathetic observers who do not wish to remain forever suspicious of the government of Hun-

gary is to permit some type of inquiry, whether by the United Nations or some other acceptable agency."

Since 1956, Hungary and the Soviet Union have blocked any direct UN investigation on Hungary and Munro has been denied access to either Budapest or Moscow.

"Would it not be possible for Hungary to invite the international Red Cross or some similar non-governmental religious or charitable organization to make appropriate inquiries and report back to the press of the world in such a way as to put to rest once and for all the suspicions and allegations..." Nesbitt said.

"The Canadian government appeals sincerely to the government of Hungary."
