that he did not look with favor on a zoning system in fixing postal rates for newspapers and added that the sorting of the newspapers for zoning would mean additional expense for publishers.

Mr. Rinfret said in his opinion the zoning of newspapers would create a "Balkanization" of Canada. He preferred standard rates regardless of distance so that ideas of communities in all parts of the country could be exchanged.

Mr. McLure countered with the suggestion that it was not fair to place the smaller newspapers in the same category with large publications of Toronto and Montreal.

Rural Mail Couriers

The Queen's Member charged that grave injustices were being visited on rural mail couriers in Prince Edward Island under the existing tender and contract system. He said that in 1946 the then postmaster-general had promised to set up a committee to investigate

ate the condition of these couriers but that the committee had never been established.

In reply, Mr. Rinfret said this had not been necessary because under the Supplemental Payments Act of that year, bonuses were given to all mail couriers who applied for them.

"That bonus", retorted Mr. McLure, "went only to a few people first until we got wise to it and had it applied to all of them."

The Postmaster-General told the Queen's member that on March 21, 1949, no less than 80 percent of rural mail couriers' contracts were re-adjusted.

There were inconsistencies and discrimination in the matter of rural mail contracts, Mr. McLure insisted.

He paid tribute to the sense of

responsibility and trustworthiness of the rural mail couriers in Queen's County but declared that many of them at present were working for the Post Office Department at "starvation wages."

Without mentioning names, Mr. McLure gave details of a number of rural mail routes in Queen's County and the yearly amount of the mail contracts. He said that in the case of two similar routes, one mail courier was getting some \$900 more than the other.

"And mind you", he added, "the courier receiving the top rate was not getting one nickel more than is due him."

The tender system, he urged, had proved itself to be discriminatory and unfair to many individuals.
