OTTAWA (CP)—A new 1961 census report issued by the bureau of statistics illustrates the degree to which education increases the earning power of Canadians. The report shows male workers aged 45 to 54 with a university degree or some university training earned an average annual income of \$7,372 in 1961. This was more than twice as much as the \$3,385 earned by males in the same age group with no high school education.
