Antarctic Ship Unable To Dock

NEW YORK (AP)—A U.S. Navy vessel arrived from the Antarctic Wednesday but was unable to dock—because of cold-weather complications.

Tugs assigned to nose the transport Towle into a Brooklyn Army Base pier fell behind schedule because of delays in prior commitments in handling other ships in ice-filled slips.

The 15,000-ton transport meanwhile stood at anchor in ice-strewn water about half a mile off the base. She had been away three months.

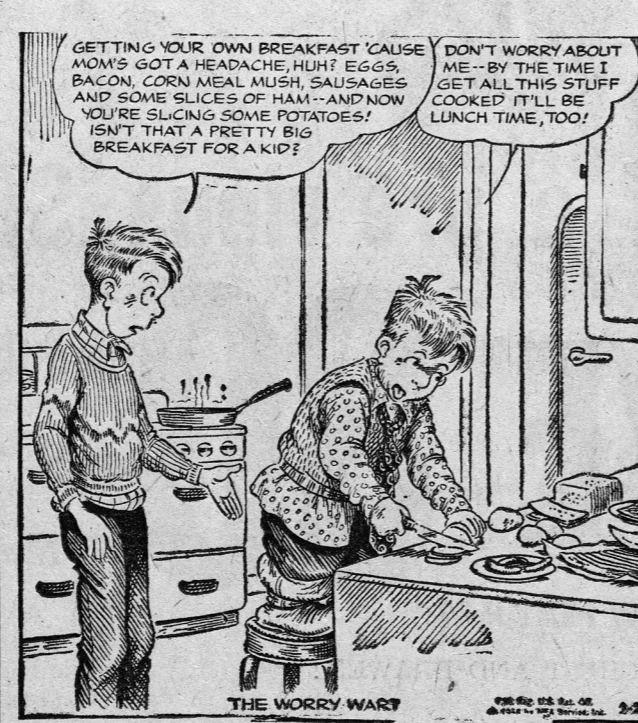

TV Big Force In Education

OTTAWA (CP) — Teachers might as well recognize that whether they like it or not, television already "is a big force in education," Richard S. Lambert of Toronto, the CBC's supervisor of school broadcasts, said Wednesday.

Mr. Lambert told the Canadian Conference on Education that regardless of whether television sets are installed in the schools, "hundreds of thousands of youngsters of school age are viewing television in their homes every day," and account should be taken of the fact.

"What they are getting on the TV screen may not always be what teachers would choose for them — but it is nonetheless educating them, informally but powerfully, for good or evil."

"We cannot afford to neglect such a powerful instrument, especially at this time when we are warned that Canada, like other Western democracies, urgently needs more trained scientists, more and better teachers, and a greater respect for intellectual achievement," he said.

School authorities should ensure that more institutions are equipped with TV receivers, and should undertake the cost of providing more programs, and of evaluating existing ones. Further action in classroom TV also depended in part upon the availability of CBC facilities for such programs. That would depend on how cost and program-time factors were met.

Television was an aid to teaching, not a substitute.

IN MEMORIAM

There passed away at his home in Bristol on December 12th, Ernest Baker in his 81st year. The deceased had been in poor health since early summer, having spent two periods in the hospital for treatment since that time and returning home just two weeks prior to his death.

The funeral which was very largely attended was conducted by his minister, Rev. John M. Sheen and was from his residence to Bristol United Church. The hymns sung were "The Lord Is My Shepherd" and "In the Sweet Bye and Bye" (choir) and "Softly and Tenderly". The minister based his message on the familiar words of John's gospel the 14th Chapter, Verses 1-3. The minister closed his message with the poem of Alfred Tennyson, "Crossing the Bar" His earthly remains were laid to rest in West St. Peter's Cemetery.
