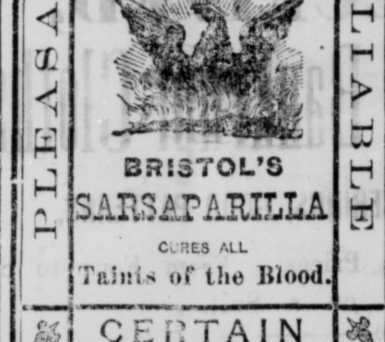

PARTIES using the Telephone would find talking much more satisfactory if they would observe the following rules:—
