A largely attended Missionary Rally was held in Hunter River United Church, on the afternoon of Sept. 26th with Mrs. J. S. MacLeod presiding.

The opening devotional exercises were conducted by the local C.G. I. T. members taking as their theme, "The Bible." Mrs. James E. Andrew gave the address of welcome and Mrs. Aubrey Cutcliffe-Frederickson, responded. Mrs. L.E. Blackie, brought greeting from the Presbyterian W. M. S.

Roll call of auxiliaries was responded to by all adjacent societies and several visitors. Mrs. R. W. Burdett rendered two solos which were enjoyed. Mrs. W. I. Bowman was organist.

Mrs. Blair Andrew gave the financial report which showed an increase over last year. Mrs. F. W. Cutcliffe, P. E. I. Presbyterian Auxiliary, introduced the two outstanding Missionaries, Dr. Florence Murray who has spent thirty years in Korea and Miss Dorothy Young of the W.M.S. executive in Toronto. Dr. Young in her address made clear the present conditions in Korea. She stressed the great need among

refugees, which due to the large population, inflation, and the land condition of the country, living conditions are made very difficult. She expressed thanks for relief parcels and told us to keep on sending them.

She made an appeal for young recruits for replacement on the mission field. Mrs. Young in her talk which was most instructive and interesting on all phases of W.M.S. work showed that through responsibility, obligation for organization, leadership, and the receiving of people for the many channels of Christian work open to them each member can find means of service right where she resides. She too made the appeal for young people to go into full-time service for the Church.

Following her address a question box was conducted in which many questions were discussed and answered by both missionaries. The offering was received by Mrs. John Craswell and Mrs. Fred Smith. Lunch was served by the Hunter River Auxiliary.

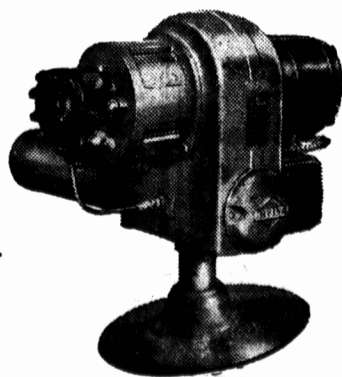
