Dulles Says No U.S. Commitments

WASHINGTON (AP) — State Secretary Dulles Friday night called Egypt's sudden move to nationalizing the Suez Canal "an angry act of retaliation against fancied grievances." While denouncing the nationalization of the canal, Dulles nevertheless stressed that any international control agreed upon should "also fully protect the legitimate interests of Egypt."

AGAINST UN CHARTER In explaining why the idea of immediate military retaliation against Egypt was rejected, he said: "This... would have been contrary to the principles of the United Nations charter and would have undoubtedly led to widespread violence, endangering the peace of the world."

Dulles noted that "some people" whom he did not identify—have counseled immediate forcible action by governments most directly affected by Premier Gamal Abdel Nasser's move in nationalizing the waterway.

Dulles expressed belief Egypt would accept such international principles if they are agreed upon by the forthcoming conference.
