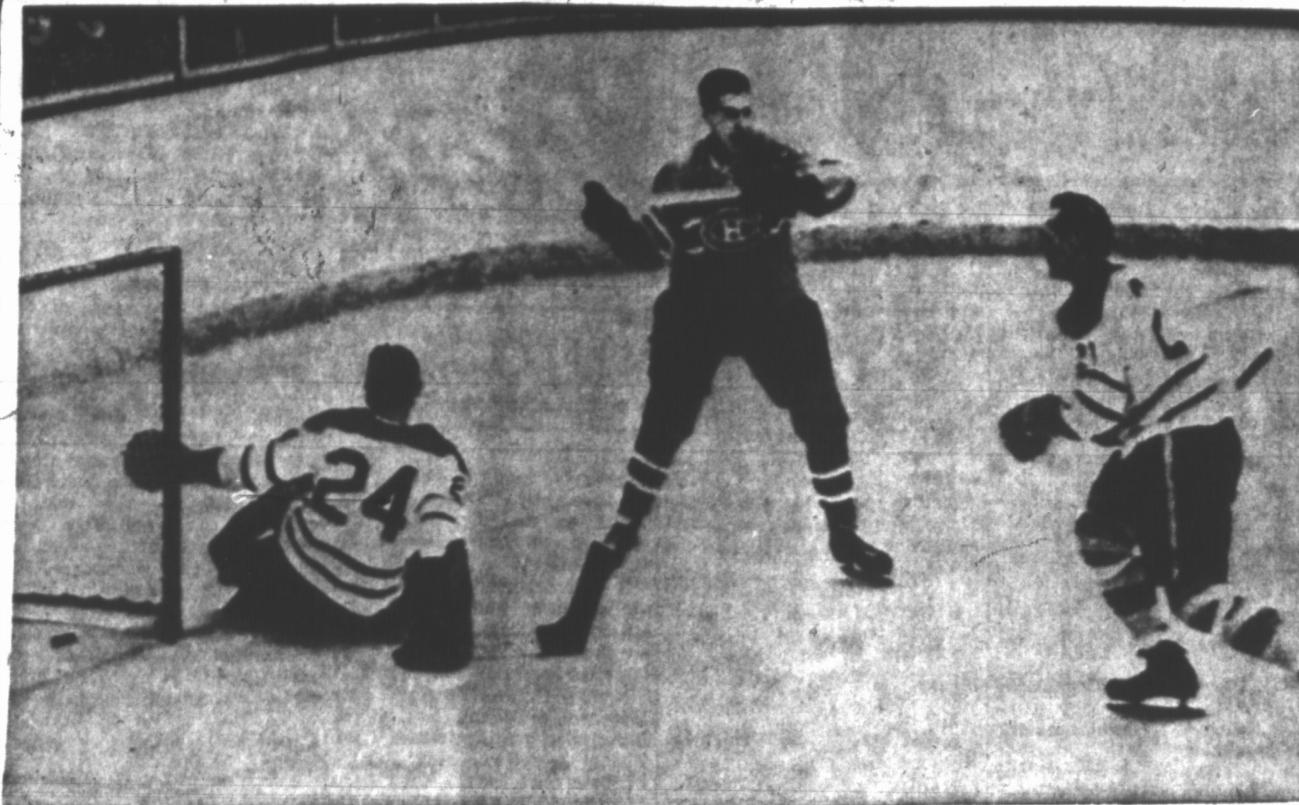

Toronto Whips Canadiens; Use Unusual Starting Line

MONTREAL (CP) — Toronto Maple Leafs got a quick goal from an unusual starting lineup of five defencemen Thursday night and went on from there to score an easy 5-2 National Hockey League victory over Montreal Canadiens.

A sellout forum crowd of 15,485 saw Tim Horton, one of five rear-guard sent out by coach Punch Imlach for the opening faceoff, blast a 5-foot slapshot into the Montreal net after only 10 seconds of play to send the Leafs off and running.

Montreal got that one back within 50 seconds, but dropped steadily back from there as Toronto pumped home another goal in the first period...

The loss was a key one for Montreal who blew a chance to take over undisputed possession of first place in the NHL standings. Instead, they remained tied with Chicago Black Hawks at 57 points...

Andy Bathgate, George Armstrong, Dave Keon and Red Kelly counted the other Leaf goals as Toronto strengthened its hold on third place with 53 points, three more than the fourth-place Detroit Red Wings.
