

**D**espite some attention from various Atlantic Canadian journalists, the students of U.P.E.I. hardly batted an eye over our first-ever sex survey. Response was moderately impressive and very few complaints were received.

With this report we hope to get students talking about sex, not just as the potential death it's now portrayed as, but also as something that has its merits. This survey may help you decide if or when you want to do it, how to do it safely and how to know what you're doing. Our survey results are highly unscientific, our researching methods thoroughly suspect and our base of data quite small, especially for the men. **DO NOT TAKE THIS TOO SERIOUSLY.** However, we believe at least some results are accurate and hopefully some of the other facts we present will give you an idea of what's going on in the secret world of sexual relations.

#### Response

114 students returned our questionnaires. The bulk of answers came from the Pit with 53. Tops among residences (by miles) were the ladies of Bernardine with 40. Blanchard and Marian combined for four votes. Female responses vastly outnumbered men -- by over two to one -- and tended to elaborate more on their answers; many questionnaires had their margins filled with comments. Male responses tended to be single words and quite a few questionnaires were nonsense. As with any anonymous questionnaire, people tend to get snide: about ten responses were discarded.

There were virtually no re-

sponses from gays and lesbians (only a single gay). Four male and four female bisexuals responded. Figures on bisexuality are even less reliable; it remains largely uncharted territory. The controversial figures of Kinsey indicated that 37 percent of men and 20 percent of women have had at least one homosexual experience to the point of orgasm since adolescence. These figures included childhood experimentation and one-time occurrences and seem unreliable, but what can reasonably

be concluded is that homosexual experimentation is a fairly common phenomenon.

## RANDOMfacts

The average nonerect penis is 2 1/2 to 4 inches long, and erect is usually 5 1/2 to slightly more than 6 inches. Nonerect penises range in length from 2 to 6 inches; erect range from 3 1/2 to a whopping 13.

50 percent of women have reported not swallowing during oral sex.

In the *Details* survey, 23 percent of men could not locate the clitoris.

The Kinsey report indicated that a "significant portion" of men have attempted autofellatio. That is, they attempt to put their penises in their own mouths, a feat which few have the flexibility to achieve.

Kinsey estimated that 75 percent of men ejaculate within 2 minutes of intromission (insertion of penis into vagina).
