Provincial Chapter Of IODE To Be Presented Standard

A provincial chapter of the IODE in Prince Edward Island was formed yesterday afternoon at a meeting of representatives of the seven primary chapters.

Officers elected to the provincial body will be announced Saturday night at a biennial ceremony, when the newly formed provincial chapter will receive its standard.

Weather Stays Cool

Low temperatures still prevail despite the lateness of the season and night time temperatures are setting new records for this time of year.

Officials at the radio range reported the thermometer sank to 28.8 degrees by 9 o'clock yesterday morning. Asked if this was a record for the date the reply was "I don't know, but it is cold enough for May 24."

At the Experimental Farm, where records have been kept for more than a half century, Warren Burns said temperature in the air was 27 but at ground level heavy white frost reduced it to 11 degrees.

The 27 was the lowest temperature ever recorded this late in May with previous lows being in the vicinity of 33 degrees, Mr. Burns said.

Defence Completes Its Case And Accused Is Remanded

Fletcher, both of Charlottetown, who at an earlier hearing pleaded guilty to the theft of live lobsters, valued less than \$50, the property of George Agnew, Counsel for the defence in both cases is Lester P. O'Donnell.

A case of summary ejection against a Charlottetown householder was adjourned until May 25, at the request of counsel for the plaintiff, J. Elmer Blanchard.

Of three persons charged with being drunk and incapable, one

was sentenced to 30 days in Queens County Jail, another was fined \$20 and costs or 10 days, and the charge against the third accused was dismissed.
